### Responding to issues in your community

Staying on the theme of joint partnership working, the SNT has been employed during November working with associate groups to safeguard the welfare of a vulnerable victim of domestic abuse. This is a good example of the 'hidden' work we do after a crime has occurred to try & reduce the risks, threats & harm to victims and prevent them being targeted again.

### Making the community safer

The SNT have been visiting primary schools in the area during November to develop plans around 'lock-down' procedures. These are the actions schools take if they face threats of various kinds where children &/or staff would be at risk. We have been advising the schools what actions to take and how to implement agreed actions if faced with such threats.

### Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Crime reduction has been high on our agenda, after a number of elderly victims were targeted by telephone scams, resulting in some having large sums of cash stolen along with bank account details. This featured on our Facebook page with prevention advice. We have also called at retail businesses providing C/R information after many were targeted 12 months ago and cash stolen as a result of insecurities.
