FURTHER INFORMATION

In previous newsletters we have looked at how our Safer Neighbourhood Teams are working and how they can support vulnerable individuals within the community. This month we inform you of what our team has been working on.

1. Members of the Halesworth team volunteered to be interviewed by year 9/10 students at the Dennington Primary School at their careers fair'. Our team were present to offer advice and guidance to the school's students.
2. Due to various complaints about parking at the Edgar Sewter Primary School, our team have conducted patrols in the area, engaged with vehicle drivers and issued warnings whilst also providing and safety advice to others
3. Our team have attended the Ilketshall St Lawrence Primary School. This was an opportunity to engage with the local school children with other partnership agencies to show reception class children how the police service helps the public around safety.
4. Our team have worked with local education welfare officers for a 'Late Gates' exercise. This is designed to help schools deal with parking related issues outside the grounds when vehicles are trying to leave at the same time as others are trying to arrive.
5. Our team visited the Childrens Centre at Reydon for a pre-school visit with marked police car.
6. Due to reports of parking complaints and anti social behaviour we have conducted visible patrols in the Wenhaston area.
7. Our team have worked with our Roads Policing department and approved a new site for a community speed watch campaign in Lowestoft Road, Reydon. We are also working with our Roads policing department regarding assessing another location along the A144 at Bramfield. Our team will continue to support the community speed watch teams in relation to speeding vehicules.

Our Major Investigation Team have been investigating a murder that took place in Weybread. Our team have been assisting by engaging with the local community, offering support by basing ourselves at the Weybread Village Hall as well as maintaining regular visible patrols in the area. Crime Prevention Advice

We ask the community to be security minded. Whilst we enjoy living in a low crime area, we are still experiencing burglaries from outbuildings as well as dwellings and also theft related offences. We ask that you ensure your property and vehicles are secure when you leave them. All valuables should be kept in a secure place, out of view from any potential thief. FURTHER INFORMATION

In the month of June your SNT has been dealing with wider issues within the community, such as:

Mental health,
Domestic violence,
Youth work with local schools,
Youth Clubs,
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB),
Vulnerable people,
Licensing issues at both on and off license premises.

The team has also responded to complaints from the general public in relation to speeding, parking, dog incidents and neighbour disputes. This work allows the response teams to focus solely on emergency calls to improve the efficiency of the organisation as a whole.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999. The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: halesworth.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
