Responding to issues in your community

Our team has been very busy responding to the needs of the community with the inclement weather. We have been working together with local farmers and 4x4 owners to help clear roads and reach vulnerable members of the community.

As the bad weather continues we would encourage all to spare a minute just to check up on the vulnerable, whether they be friends, family, neighbours or someone you have never spoken to. Have they got enough food, heating, medication? Is their water supply frozen? Anything you can do to help.

Making the community safer

Our Police Community Support Officers are starting work on rolling out a scheme to help the elderly and those suffering with dementia in care homes with an information protocol called the Herbert Protocol to help officers if someone is reported missing from care. This early information protocol can be vital in the first hours of this kind of incident and can provide key information about a person's history and family ties to particular areas that can be so important in finding them as soon as possible.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

SNT & Neighbourhood Response Team officers attended a social housing development in a small village following a report of ASB from a resident. An issue with a male staying with another tenant was identified in relation to alleged ASB and both parties were visited. Follow up work with our partners at Flagship Housing is pending to prevent and deter future reports and issues.

Partnership Working.

After a request for assistance from Suffolk Trading Standards, SNT helped locate an area close to a village where it was reported to them that sheep were in a bad physical condition and some had died. The area was located enabling Trading Standards to investigate and ascertain if any offences had been committed.
