WE DID...

1. On-Going priority for Haverhill based on information from the community. Officers continue to carry out targeted patrols in areas frequented by persons committing drug related offences. This is covered by a long term Operation designed to reduce crime and the fear of crime in relation to drugs.
2. Ongoing ASB in the area of Snowdon Court which is having a detrimental effect on particular residents. Officers have conducted foot patrols around the area, and working with partner agencies to tackle the anti-social behaviour of the few who are causing the problems.

FURTHER INFORMATION

- UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is for February 2017. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

-The 4 x Dwelling Burglaries took place in Cavendish x 1, Hawstead x 1, Haverhill North x 1 and Haverhill East x 1. The incident at the property in Cavendish involved the intruder gaining access via a window and jewellery targeted. A male was arrested in relation to a separate offence elsewhere in the county and was further arrested for this crime but no further action was taken. In relation to the incident at Hawstead entry via window but nothing appears taken at this time. The Haverhill offences are not connected, with only the Haverhill East currently being worked on.

Robbery relates to an offence in Hardwick road area of Haverhill in the early hours of 19th Feb with a group of male suspects assaulting the victim and making off with personal property - enquiries ongoing.


- Drug Enforcement - A warrant was executed in Haverhill (February). Two males were arrested and bailed in relation to a seizure of Class B drugs and cash/mobile phones seized. Local officers continue to gather intelligence.

* When we first become aware of a drug offence, we record a 'holding' crime. This allows time for us to establish what sort of drug offence we are dealing with ie Simple possession / Possession with intent to supply / Conspiracy to supply. It also allows time for a laboratory to check the type of drug. When all of this information is known, the holding crime is changed to to the appropriate 'drug trafficking' offence. This is why the number of crimes does not mirror the action being taken.

Proactive work carried out in March by HH SNT Officers:

Fixed penalty notices issued in respect of illegal parking around Murton Slade, Haverhill.

Speed enforcement carried out in the villages of Withersfield, Whepstead and Hargrave.

On 22/03/17 Pc Marshall and Pcs0 Agravat assisted staff at Samuel Ward Academy with mock interviews with the Year 10's. The officers came back reporting the pupils were very competent and came across very well during their 'tough' questioning, we wish them well with their future interviews.

Sunday 4th April saw the Constabulary celebrating its 50th Anniversary. Pc Marshall had the pleasure in attending along with several of our Cadets and a special guest - Mr E Wright, a former Suffolk Sgt who served with us 1953-1983. Mr Wright presented Darren Marshall with a comprehensive report giving an overview of his time in the Force which makes enlightening reading. One notable mention being ' patrols were either on foot or bicycle, before leaving the station the duty Sgt would nominate certain places at defined times where you had to be for 5 mins during your patrol. These were called conference points. Most of these points were at a telephone box where the duty Sgt would either meet you, call you or ignore you. ' A bit different to today's policing.

PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY The effectiveness of investing in home security has recently been highlighted in Bury St Edmunds in an attempted burglary that has resulted in the arrest of a prolific burglar. The home owner in question had fitted a video enabled door bell. This sent a message to his phone alerting them that someone was at the his door of his house and streamed a video of the person, in this case trying to break in.
