WE DID...

1. On-Going priority for Haverhill based on information from the community. Officers continue to carry out targeted patrols in areas frequented by persons committing drug related offences. This is covered by a long term Operation designed to reduce crime and the fear of crime in relation to drugs. See below for latest update.
2. Two females issued with Community Protection Notices, and another female with a Community Protection Warning Letter addressing their persistent anti-social behaviour causing an issue to the public and/or to the emergency services.

- UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is for December 2017. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

-The 13 x Dwelling Burglaries took place in, Clare x 1 / Kedington x 2/ Stoke By Clare x 1 / Hundon x 1 / Haverhill North x 2 / Haverhill East x 4 / Haverhill West x 1 and Haverhill South x 1. One suspect was arrested for a Haverhill burglary but was No Further Actioned. These figures also include attempted burglaries.

-DRUG ENFORCEMENT UPDATE -

-A warrant was executed in Haverhill (January). Male was arrested and bailed in relation to Class A and B drugs and possession of a Dangerous dog. Early February saw more arrests and drug seizures including:


- Vehicle of interest stopped / searched in Haverhill - Drugs found and man arrested
- Three arrested at address in Haverhill after house search. Cash and drugs seized
- Warrant executed at Haverhill address - Several people searched but nothing found.

* When we first become aware of a drug offence, we record a 'holding' crime. This allows time for us to establish what sort of drug offence we are dealing with ie Simple possession / Possession with intent to supply / Conspiracy to supply. It also allows time for a laboratory to check the type of drug. When all of this information is known, the holding crime is changed to to the appropriate 'drug trafficking' offence. This is why the number of crimes does not mirror the action being taken.

Proactive work carried out in January by HH SNT Officers:

- Assisting colleagues in the East re Op Barnet which was in response to the possible tidal surge.
- Speed check in Clare on 28th Jan - no speeding tickets issued.
- House to house enquiries re Op Phonetic re missing person Corrie McKeague in Bury St Edmunds
- During the evening of Tuesday 24th January, three Police Cadets accompanied the SNT for a dedicated Motor Crime prevention foot patrol in Clare. Eleven unattended vehicles were found with either valuables clearly on show, insecurities or other "like" situations. Polite and respectful advisory letters will be sent to the registered keepers bringing our findings to their attention. Several members of the community saw and engaged with the Cadets and they welcomed their visit.

-A reminder to motorists to ensure they check and maintain their vehicles. This is especially more prudent this time of year with the changeable weather conditions and the salt and dirt the vehicles pick up. We're asking drivers to particularly check their lights; as we've seen many vehicles driven with a light out, wiper blades are in good order and to keep lights and number plates clear of dirt.
