WE DID...

- 1. On-Going priority for Haverhill based on information from the community. Officers continue to carry out targeted patrols and to execute warrants in areas frequented by persons committing drug related offences. This is covered by a long term Operation designed to reduce crime and the fear of crime in relation to drugs. (Further update below).
- 2. Officers have been patrolling the area engaging with only a small number of youths and an older male following calls of illegal use of a motorbike/car. Suitable advice given and liaison made with local councillor to advise other local school children not to accept rides with a person not entitled to use such vehicles.

FURTHER INFORMATION

- UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is for April 2017. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

-The four Dwelling Burglaries for April took place in : Haverhill East x 3. Two of those were at properties that had been unoccupied for 4-6 months / Haverhill North x 1.

- The Robbery offence took place in Haverhill on 2nd April 17 and was circulated in the media. This was the crime in which a lady was robbed on her way to church in Camps Road. This investigation is still on going, led by CID.

- Drug Enforcement - 1 x Warrant for May in Haverhill. This led to four arrests and a seizure of drugs, cash and other drug related equipment. The Western area pro active team have continued to join local officers in patrols, targeting drug users and dealers.

* When we first become aware of a drug offence, we record a 'holding' crime. This allows time for us to establish what sort of drug offence we are dealing with ie Simple possession / Possession with intent to supply / Conspiracy to supply. It also allows time for a laboratory to check the type of drug. When all of this information is known, the holding crime is changed to to the appropriate 'drug trafficking' offence. This is why the number of crimes does not mirror the action being taken.

- OTHER NEWS

-The investigation is continuing into the assault on a child in the area of Greenfields Way, Haverhill on 17th May 17. Details of this have been published in the media as follows :

Police are appealing for information after a 10-year-old boy reported being approached and grabbed by a man in Haverhill this afternoon. Officers were contacted around 4.10pm today, Wednesday 17 May, about the incident which happened in Greenfields Way in the town a short time earlier. The boy had run home to report that a man had ran up behind him, grabbed his back and tried to pull his trousers down. The boy had been close to the primary school and the doctors surgery when the incident happened and police are asking anyone who may have been in the area between 3.15pm and 4.30pm today to come forward. The man is described as black, possibly in his 30s or 40s, of average build and wearing a dark coat and jeans.

Proactive work carried out in May by Haverhill SNT Officers:

Fixed penalty notices issued and advisory notes in respect of illegal parking around Murton Slade, Broads St and Queens St Haverhill, as well as Maltings Lane, Clare.

Speed checks conducted in the rural area with only one driver reported for speeding.

Reminder that whilst we have some hot weather, we are receiving calls relating to dogs being seen in vehicles causing them and those witnessing this, some levels of distress. Just bear in mind that whilst the temperature is 20C degrees outside of the vehicle, you can add at least another 20 degrees for the temperature inside the vehicle. Just think - do you need to leave your dog in the vehicle whilst you go shopping - you could end up with a smashed window for your trouble as police officers will do this as a last resort to retrieve a suffering animal.
