## Haverhill

### You said...

Thefts of charity boxes by a male and female in the town. Further begging complaints by the same couple.

### We did...

After the team worked on 5 separate offences obtaining statements and reviewing CCTV, a 38-year-old man and a 36-year-old woman, both from the Haverhill area, were arrested on 30/11/2017 in relation to a number of thefts in the town. They were taken to Bury St Edmunds Police Investigation Centre for questioning and subsequently released under investigation pending further enquiries.

The female was also issued with a Community Protection Notice which details if she continues to begging she will be arrested. The male was given a final warning.

As a result of these patrols a local male was arrested on the Clements estate with 38 wraps believed to be Class A seized on suspicion of Possession of drugs with intent to supply and was questioned at Bury St Edmunds Police Investigation Centre and subsequently released under investigation.

### Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

SNT officers have been conducting enquiries and making regular patrols around the area of Brybank Road in Haverhill, this follows youths causing ASB towards a particular residential property and making life difficult for the owners. Please report any such behaviour via 101 or 999 depending on the severity.

Pcso Scott has been patrolling the area around Highpoint Prison over the last few months in order to prevent any 'throw overs' which isn't an issue related solely to Highpoint. We would like any information on anyone acting suspiciously around the fence line of the prison, particularly a male seen on a bicycle 22nd Nov at 11am with 4 suspicious packages intercepted by staff later on.

Officers were out in numbers mixing with the shoppers during the late night shopping and enjoying the fireworks on 1st Dec which proved a successful event as always - well done to all involved with this popular event.

A reminder to be extra vigilant and ensure your properties are secure with appropriate lighting and if possible alarms and/or CCTV fitted following a spate of house burglaries particularly in the rural villages - CID officers are currently investigating.
