Operation Woven

This bespoke operation is having a really positive impact in tackling street crime, violence and drug offences which impact on the daily lives of our residents and businesses.

In the Central SNT area alone since the start of March there have been the following results:

8 arrests for possession of class A drugs

2 arrests for robbery

1 drugs warrant executed

3 Closure notices issued against properties in Granville St, St Helen's St and Rope Walk linked to supply of drugs and continued ASB.

1 notice has resulted in the property at Rope Walk being closed for 3 months and the tenant evicted by Ipswich Borough Council

Seizure of several £1000s and assorted weapons.

2 London missing juveniles have been returned to their home addresses as a result of being located in Ipswich.

Parking in Providence Street, St Stephen's Lane and Arras Square

The above areas are subject to a Pedestrianisation Order made by Ipswich Borough Council in 1988 (ref no.56) or restricted access for loading only, and we are receiving numerous complaints in respect of vehicles being parked at the locations. Vehicles are not permitted to park in these locations and will be subject to enforcement through the issuing of fixed penalty notices.

Rough Sleeping within The Town Centre

We are continuing to work with partners and local charities in respect of rough sleeping, and are in the process of contacting the owner of the now empty BHS building, along with other vacant/derelict buildings to address the attraction of these locations to those sleeping rough.

We undertake monthly assertive outreach engagements with partners to identify those sleeping rough and ensure they are able to gain access to the services, and charities available to all in Ipswich.

PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY

As the weather improves, please make sure that you secure all sheds, garages etc so that they do not become easy targets for those intent on stealing.

The same applies to vehicles, please make sure they are locked and secure when you leave them. Do not leave anything of value in the vehicle, even in the glove-box, or on display.

Invest in a quality lock for your pedal cycles.

If you are going out, and especially overnight, please make sure that all windows and doors are shut and locked as appropriate - any vulnerability will be exploited by thieves.

We have seen an increase in the number of thefts from sheds, vehicles and theft of pedal cycles recently.

The effectiveness of investing in home security has recently been highlighted in Bury St Edmunds in an attempted burglary that has resulted in the arrest of a prolific burglar. The home owner in question had fitted a video enabled door bell. This sent a message to his phone alerting them that someone was at the his door of his house and streamed a video of the person, in this case trying to break in. The police were alerted and on viewing the video footage were able to identify the offender and make an arrest.
