FURTHER INFORMATION

In May Central SNT were successful at court in apply for a Criminal Behavior Order against a prolific town centre shoplifter, Shaun Gull.

The order states he is prohibited from entering any retail premises within the main retail area of The Town centre for a period of 2 years.

If he breaches this order, he will be arrested and can received a custodial sentence.

His actions have cost many retailers in The Town thousands of pounds of loss, and his behavior has upset and intimidated many store staff over the years.

Op Woven and our Drugs Team continue to have a really strong impact in disrupting those dealing drugs and using violence to run their businesses. Since March, they have made over 100 arrests, sized thousands of pounds worth of cash and drugs. The Teams and the SNT are working closely with partners in the Council, Housing, Education and Health to ensure those needing help outside enforcement are receiving it.

They have also removed knives and other weapons from the streets of Ipswich, that could have been used to cause serious harm or injury.

Working with one of our housing provider partners, Circle Housing, a closure order was obtained in May for a property in Wilberforce Street. The address was a magnet for drug use and ASB in the area. The tenant has been removed for a period of at least 3 months

As the weather improves, we are receiving an increase in reports of persons sleeping rough in and around The Town centre and Waterfont.

We continue to work with all relevant partners and charities to ensure those who are genuinely in need have access to all the help they require.

Emergency beds are available at Cavendish Lodge overnight, 7 nights a week, and staff at The Chapman Centre (IHAG) work closely with us to refer persons to their services (housing advice, financial advice, advocacy services), as do IBC housing Options

FURTHER INFORMATION

We are getting more and more complaints about inconsiderate cycling through The Town.

Cycling is allowed through Westgate Street, Tavern Street and Buttermarket, however we would ask that cyclists and pedestrians respect each other in these areas. Cycling through the town centre at speed is not acceptable and could cause accidents.

Cycling is only permitted on pavements where there is a clearly marked cycle path. If there is no cycle path, cyclists are expected to use the main roadway, ensuring that they do so safely and observe all road signs, lights and junctions.

As the weather improves (well tries to anyway!) we again ask that people make sure that all doors, gates, windows etc on houses, sheds, outbuildings are secure and that cars and vans are locked when not being used.

1/3 of the burglary reports we receive and a large number of the theft from motor vehicle reports are due to opportunists finding insecurities and then helping themselves to the spoils within.

Immobilise is the largest FREE register of possession ownership details, and helps police identify the owners of recovered property.
