YOU SAID...

1. Anti-Social behaviour (ASB) in the Town Centre.
2. Anti-Social behaviour in the area of Westgate ward.

WE DID...

1. Proactive patrols by Police officers and PCSOs continue to target street drinking and associated ASB within town centre, particularly the Upper Orwell St and adjoining roads. Significant numbers of alcohol seizures continue to be made.
2. Proactive police patrols continuing under Operation Reservoir, within Westgate ward area. Analysis of police call data and incidents show the number of locations of crime and ASB have reduced, with "hotspots" now more concentrated in fewer locations. Analysis and Intelligence returns also show a number of key individuals previously involved in the crime and ASB locally have now begun frequenting areas outside of the Westgate ward.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Policing Operations within the Central SNT Area:

September saw the Safer Neighbourhood Teams, from across the Southern Area undertake, a "Week of Action" between 26th - 30th. During that week, officers from Ipswich central SNT joined colleagues from Southeast and Southwest SNTs, supported by specialist units from the Roads Policing and Dog sections, in targeting those locations which local communities have highlighted particular anti-social behaviour (ASB) issues (which have not already been subject of community priorities).

Within the Ipswich Central area, officers undertook additional targeted foot and vehicle patrols at locations identified as being subject of low level ASB and nuisance. The majority of the patrols were conducted during the evenings and saw results which included 1 person arrested for burglary, 2 persons for breach of bail conditions, 7 dispersals and 5 alcohol seizures.

The week of action also presented an opportunity for the team, supported by colleagues from the Roads Policing Unit to particularly target road traffic related offences and nuisance, at locations highlighted by local communities.

During the 5 day period, the following was achieved:

- 94 drivers stopped and spoken to within the Central SNT area.
- 64 drivers reported for traffic offences relating to driving behaviour (exceeding speed limits, using mobile phone whilst driving, fail to wear seat belt, no insurance) and vehicle condition (no MOT, vehicle in dangerous condition, defective tyres)
- 3 vehicles seized (no insurance and vehicle nuisance)
- 1 vehicle prohibition notice issued
- 12 drivers breath tested (no arrests)
- 3 drivers roadside drug tested (no arrests)
