WE DID...

1. carried out a community surgery in Garrick Way, and collected concerns. due to this we have made arrests and issued 'community protection notice' with investigations ongoing bail conditions have been imposed and there has been an increase in high visibility patrols and mobile police station in the area. Currently working with IBC to install a mobile CCTV at location. Multi- agency meeting to take place with councillors and local partnerships
2. There has been a joint visit between the police and IBC to get these issues under control. Warning letters have been issued and as a result the two main offenders are now behaving and we have received fewer calls to the location
3. Increase in police patrols at key times to prevent offences. SNT surgery within the Park - spoke to all residents and handed out a questionnaire encouraging their thoughts and concerns of issues in the area. Currently in discussion with Greenways project and Environmental health to look at cutting back the vegetation along the river path.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Bridge Ward: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 122 investigations were recorded.

1 attempted burglary dwelling. 3 burglary dwellings where one suspect is currently on bail. There have been 2 theft from motor vehicles and 2 theft of motor vehicles. There has been 3 Robberies reported where a suspect has been arrested and subsequently charged and held in custody for court. Great policing effort with SNT and CID working together.

Gipping Ward: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 144 investigation were recorded.

1 Attempted Burglary dwelling and 1 Burglary dwelling where the offender has been identified and dealt with out of court. There have been 4 theft from motor vehicles suspects unknown and 1 theft of motor vehicle. There has been an increase of 8 reports of damage to vehicles.

Stoke Park: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 58 investigations were recorded.

There have been no reports of dwelling burglary. There has been an increase of 5 criminal damage to dwellings reported, suspects unknown. There have been 3 theft form motor vehicles and a theft of a motor cycle that is outstanding.

Sprites: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 39 investigations were recorded. There have been no burglary dwellings reported, vehicle crime is on the decrease with 1 theft of motor vehicle which is still outstanding and two reports of criminal damage to motor vehicle. One male has been arrested and interviewed for theft in dwelling.

Castle Hill: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 75 investigations were recorded.

There have been no burglary dwellings reported. There have been reports of burglary other building at business premises targeted 3 times – work is ongoing with security at premises and reassurance visits. Vehicle crime is on the increase with 16 theft from motor vehicles, 4 criminal damage to motor vehicles and 3 interference with motor vehicle, male was stopped and searched at the time insufficient to arrest. There have been 8 reports of criminal damage to buildings.

Whitehouse: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 91 investigations were recorded.

There have been no burglary dwellings reported, 3 burglary other building. There have been 6 theft form motor vehicles and 2 theft of motor vehicles where only one has been recovered. There have been 2 reports of criminal damage where an offender has been charged and 3 criminal damage to vehicles

FURTHER INFORMATION

Whitton: Between 01/10/2016 and 31/10/2016 a total of 118 investigations recorded.

No burglary dwellings reported, There have been 7 reports of criminal damage to dwellings. Vehicle crime continues 7 criminal damage to vehicles, 4 theft from motor vehicles and 1 theft of motor vehicle 1 male detained.

2 persons have been arrested and are on bail to police and court for a series of offences and are subject to conditions. This has seen a reduction in ASB and offences being reported.

Since the 10th August the Southern part of Suffolk has suffered 136 burglaries. Although a high number of these have been in the more rural areas, Ipswich has seen an increase. Therefore we would like to remind residents of the need to take simple measures, as below, to help prevent them from becoming a victim of burglary.

Several burglaries have been via insecurities however some have occurred where glass at the rear of the property has been broken. Therefore if you see anything suspicious or hear the sound of breaking glass please report this immediately to the Police on 101 or 999 for a crime in progress.

- Keep your doors locked at all times, even when you are in the house or in your garden, but especially when you go out.
- Do not leave any keys in locks or close to doors or windows. Make sure you have a fire plan so you can get out in the case of a fire.
- Avoid keeping valuable jewellery in obvious places eg - jewellery boxes, under the bed or at the bottom of the wardrobe in the master bedroom.
- If using a safe please ensure this is secured to a solid floor see www.securedbydesign.com for details.
- Take photographs of all such items (laid beside a ruler) & store these in a safe place.
- Register all valuable items on www.immobilise.com
- Large quantities of cash should never be kept at home.
- Do not leave bricks or tools etc in the garden that could be used to break glass or force entry with.
- Keep back gates locked, with key operated lock eg padlock and make sure that there is nothing that could be used to climb over with, such as a wheelie bin.

Vehicle Crime – Remove valuables and lock vehicles. Police are once again appealing to car owners to always lock their vehicles and remove valuable items. Police are encouraging car owners to get into the habit of locking vehicles where ever the vehicles are parked and for any length of time. Check that the lock has engaged. Setting an alarm or immobiliser will make it more difficult for a thief. Make use of a garage to make your vehicle more secure. By doing this, it could make the area less appealing to offenders and discourage them to commit crime. Suffolk is a safe County, but everyone has a responsibility to help make it even safer.
