Responding to issues in your community

We have worked with partners to continue to address the issue raised by rough sleeping and begging within the Town Centre and continue to raise the profile of Help our Homeless. we have issued 2 closure notices to properties in respect of drug related ASB in the last month.

Making the community safer

We are undertaking work with our various Council, Social and Private Housing providers to ensure that door entry systems and gated access to their properties are in good working order and limited to tenant and genuine guest access only. This then insures the safety of some of our more vulnerable community members.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

We continue with our monthly Mobile Police Station events on the Cornhill, and have been raising the issue of cycle safety/security through the month of July into August. Op Parkland continues to target hot spot areas for ASB/Crime and under Op Velocity we have continued to target drug related crime and gang ASB within the Town centre.
