### Responding to issues in your community

Received reports of ASB in the parks in Ipswich, particularly Christchurch and Alexandra Parks. Police have increased patrols in these areas and have been successful in disrupting suspicious and ASB behaviour. Police have consulted with local councilors and residents and 'hot spots' have been identified within these locations and will be subject of targeted patrols.

### Making the community safer

Police have identified drug dealing 'Hot spots' in the town centre and have conducted reassurance patrols in these areas, particularly St Helen's Primary school and a new CCTV camera has been erected in the local vicinity. A successful Class A drugs warrant was executed in Bond Street where two were arrested and Class A drugs and weapons recovered. A knife bin has been located in Bramford Road near to Stopford Court in response to recent knife crime in the town.

### Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Operation Parkland continues to address ASB across the summer months. The Team have been seeking views from residents in our identified hot spots and have been tasked with actioning these issues.
