Responding to issues in your community

During the month of January 2019 there was a total of 823 investigations in the East of Ipswich. (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also safeguarding individuals). Criminal Offences recorded range from various assaults and public order offences to theft and burglary and drug possession.

Making the community safer

Following the Policing restructure in October 2018 the Safer Neighbourhood Team have been working closely with the new Link Officer and PCSO to address local ASB issues in your area. "Street meets" will be taking place in order for the Police to hear the concerns of those affected by continued ASB and work with other agencies to come to a resolution.

We are currently investigating reports of a suspicious vehicle that has been seen near schools in your area. We ask that you remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity to the Police as soon as possible using 999. Please take the time to speak to your children about "Stranger Danger" as we continue to investigate.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

PCSO Gemma Read has now started her new fully funded role in Kesgrave and Rushmere St Andrew. Based at the North East Safer Neighbourhood Team Office on Heath Road Ipswich PCSO Gemma Read will be tasked to undertake visible patrols, tackle low level ASB and provide any local policing advice as required. There will be a chance for members of the public to speak to their PCSO during regular Police Surgeries.

The East of Ipswich has been experiencing a rise in the theft from Motor Vehicles. We advise that you secure your vehicle and refrain from leaving any valuables inside your vehicle overnight.
