YOU SAID...

1. ASB occurring on Rushmere Heath.
2. ASB use of mopeds, motorbikes on open spaces around East Ipswich
3. ASB at Selkirk Road, Coop.

WE DID...

1. Continued targeted patrols in and around the heath. Encountering young people and dealing with any ASB including underage drinking and criminal damage. The SNT will continue to monitor this area and deal with any ASB direct. We were extremely impressed by the behaviour of those leaving school at the end of the school year. There were no reports of anti social behaviour on the heath during that period.
2. The use of mopeds and motorbikes on the open spaces around the East of Ipswich, has decreased since the beginning of this issue being mad a priority. Our team are pro-actively targeting those individuals responsible and have gathered intelligence and issued Section 59 warnings to moped and motorbike users, who ride in an anti social manner. This pro-active approach will continue, along with Engaging with users of the areas concerned offering advice and reassurance.
3. Our SNT officers in conjunction with the antisocial manger from East of England COOP, are contiuing towards engaging with the youth and their families to understand what the issues and concerns are. Both the Police and the COOP are working towards a long term solution for the community. At this time several youth have received community resolutions for their behaviour and we continue to meet and engage any unruly behaviour head on.

WHATS HAPPENING ON YOUR WARD? 1st - 31st July 2016

BIXLEY:

We have recorded a total of 58 Investigations. 1 burglary offence, 4 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle) and 13 theft offences.

ST JOHNS:

We have recorded a total of 45 Investigations. 1 burglary offences, 6 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle), 5 theft offences.

RUSHMERE:

We have recorded a total of 50 Investigations. 0 burglary offences, 3 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle), 13 theft offences.

RUSHMERE ST ANDREW:

We have recorded a total of 12 Investigations. 0 burglary offences, 0 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle), 2 theft offences.

GAINSBOROUGH:

We have recorded a total of 67 Investigations. 2 burglary offence, 5 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle). 9 theft offences.

PRIORY HEATH:

We have recorded a total of 107 Investigations. 1 burglary offences, 7 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle), 18 theft offences.

HOLYWELLS:

We have recorded a total of 61 Investigations. 0 burglary offences, 3 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle), 8 theft offences.

KESGRAVE:

We have recorded a total of 53 Investigations. 0 burglary offences, 13 criminal damage offences (both building & vehicle), 11 theft offences.

Difference in detailed offences to totals will be made up of such things as public order offences, Violence with and without injury, domestic incidents and harassment along with other agency referrals.

FURTHER INFORMATION

You will often see advice from Suffolk Police about the importance of property marking, but how do you properly mark the property you own?

There are a number of ways of security marking your valuables to protect them against theft and assist the police to return them to you if they have been stolen and recovered.

These include:

Ultra violet (UV) or invisible marking - UV pens put an invisible mark on your property that can only be seen under UV light.

Engraving or etching - Both methods are suitable for many hard surfaces and can be done using an electric engraving tool or hand engraver.

Ceramic marking - Ceramic marking pens are designed to mark china, glass or glazed surfaces. They do not cut or scratch the surface but do leave a permanent mark.

Forensic marking solutions - These are harmless solutions that contain a unique forensic code (like a fingerprint), making it easy to identify marked items.

When using UV marker or engraver add your post code and house number to the item you are marking.

NEVER LEAVE AN OPEN INVITE

Residents are being advised to 'Close it, Lock it, Check it' and be vigilant with their home security to help keep burglars at bay.

During the past month there have been incidents of access being gained via open windows.

Please make sure you remain vigilant with your home security:

- Keep your doors locked at all times, even when you are in the house.
- Keep windows locked especially at night and when you go out, especially vulnerable windows such as those down stairs.
- Do not leave any keys in locks or close to doors or windows. Make sure you have a fire plan so you can get out in the case of a fire.
- Check your garden to ensure there is nothing that could be used to force entry with.
- Keep back gates locked and make sure that there is nothing that could be used to climb over with, such as a wheelie bin.
- Register your valuables for free at www.immobilise.com If recovered by police they can be returned to you and registration may assist in a prosecution and deterring crime.
- Report anything suspicious immediately on 101 or 999 in an emergency.

Remember, Close it, Lock it, Check it.

Vehicle Crime – Remove valuables and lock vehicles

Police are once again appealing to car owners to always lock their vehicles and remove valuable items. During the past month there have been several incidents where entry was gained to unlocked vehicles. Some residents are leaving cars unlocked even when the vehicles are parked on driveways.

Police are encouraging car owners to get into the habit of locking vehicles where ever the vehicles are parked and for any length of time. Check that the lock has engaged. Setting an alarm or immobiliser will make it more difficult for a thief. Make use of a garage to make your vehicle more secure.

By doing this, it could make the area less appealing to offenders and discourage them to commit crime.
