Responding to issues in your community

During the month of September there have been a total of 595 investigations in Ipswich East. This is down from August, where we recorded 687 investigations. These relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also safeguarding individuals). Each ward has been affected by residential/garage/shed burglaries, thefts from motor vehicles, criminal damage and ASB incidents.

Making the community safer

Speeding continues to be a major concern of our local communities, across each ward. We are continuing to deploy the Speed Indication Device (SID) throughout the East Ipswich area. Our SNT officers have been deploying these devices on a daily basis on the roads initially identified and this will continue to happen throughout our SNT area.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

There are ongoing ASB issues in the area of Broadlands Way involving anti-social use of motor vehicles and littering which are being addressed with the regular SNT patrols and continued assistance of our NRT colleagues. A barrier is due to be installed which will go some way to resolving this issue.
