We did...

1. Regular SNT and NRT patrols of the Nacton area including Queens Way to disrupt, detect crime and prevent ASB.
2. The NE SNT and Central SNT have worked together to combat these issues and regular patrols will be in place to tackle street drinking and ASB.
3. SNT PCSO is collating details of cars gathering there with a view to using the CPN process. A Section 59 warning will be issued in the next few days. Shops have reported less litter and no cars meeting in the One Stop Shop due to ANPR camera

Responding to issues in your community

During the month of October 2018 there was a total of 838 investigations in the East of Ipswich. (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also safeguarding individuals). Criminal Offences recorded range from various assaults and public order offences to theft and burglary and drug possession.

Making the community safer

There has been an increase in Police patrols in the Nacton area carried out by the Safer Neighbourhood Team and the Neighbourhood Response Teams to provide reassurance to local residents. The aim of the patrols is to disrupt individuals concerned in crime and to reduce Anti Social Behaviour. We have adopted a multi agency approach and two dedicated Youth Support Workers have been engaging with young people in the area.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Between 13th and 20th October Suffolk Constabulary supported Hate Crime Awareness week "any crime that is motivated by hostility on the grounds of disability, religion or belief, race, sexual orientation or transgender identity can be classed as a hate crime"

On 27th October 2018 Police launched a new approach to Crime Prevention. The new brand known as 1st Principal originates from Sir Robert Peel's nine principals of modern Policing. Visit www.suffolk.police.uk/advice/crime-prevention-z for advice on Crime Prevention.
