Responding to issues in your community

We had made been made aware of ASB issues on the West and one specific offender that was causing the most harm to our community. There has been numerous investigations raised which has now led to an arrest. Enquiries are ongoing.

The SNT Pc's are currently working 12 hour shifts to carry out reassurance patrols in the West of Ipswich. This includes manning the mobile police station. There will be locations that this is due to visit that have been detailed in Future Events within the news letter. We would encourage those that wish to come and have a chat to do so. There will also be foot patrols over the West of Ipswich for further reassurance.

Making the community safer

Operation Parkland has now seen its first wave of street meets in preparation for the summer. Data has been obtained from previous years and this has highlighted hot spot areas for ASB over the summer months. These have been the areas we have been looking at initially and we are hoping to be able to prevent issues even starting for the local communities.

Part of this process is working with the schools and identifying those that could engage in ASB and having early intervention to prevent this. There will be local incentives running over the summer and once confirmed we will release more details.

Preventing, Reducing and Solving Crime and ASB

The Constabulary has created a new role of Community Engagement Officer and we are pleased to have Pc 1397 Dave Wright join the team to carry out this role. He is also responsible for the Hadleigh area and will share his time between both locations.

The CEO's, which will be officially launched by the Constabulary on June 18th , have been introduced to work alongside the Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT's) in tackling locality based crime, anti-social behaviour and problem solving key local issues. The CEO's will be locally visible and accessible with the aim of strengthening engagement within communities and will work with partners and the voluntary sector, highlight and promote public events, develop and support volunteering opportunities, support crime prevention initiatives and ensure timely information is provided to the public using various forms of digital media such as Twitter and Facebook.

Pc Wright now has a Facebook page situated off of the main Constabulary page under Ipswich West and Hadleigh shortcut and he will be using the Twitter accounts of either the Ipswich West or Hadleigh SNT's to provide updates and communications. Communication is a 2 way process. Please let him know your concerns and issues.
