# FURTHER INFORMATION

This month we have been working on:

Our team has also been working with local residents and partner agencies regarding ASB related incidents in the Leiston area. We have assisted housing providers in addressing a range of neighbour disputes, an arrest was made in relation to four neighbour related incidents.

Victims of ASB have been supported whilst our team continues to work with partner agencies to resolve the issues.

Our team have been dealing with parking infringements in Aldeburgh, Leiston, Saxmundham and Framlingham. A report of inconsiderate parking in a residential street in Leiston was investigated resulting in the owner being warned. A number of parking tickets have been issued for parking offences over the last month.

Our team have conducted speed monitoring in Aldeburgh, Leiston and Framlingham. A number of drivers were recorded over the speed limit and twenty five warning letters have been sent to those drivers involved. One of the drivers has been spoken with by police and warned about their driving.

Following incidents of anti-social behaviour we have interviewed various people in relation to anti-social behaviour and criminal damage in Leiston, resulting in one person being reported for a public order related offence.

Our team have conducted visible patrols at the disused caravan park in Leiston following complaints from residents. We have also delivered letters and spoken with local residents ensuring they have the correct contact details for our team, asking them to report any further incidents to assist our work in the area.

Due to a theft of material from a local church, businesses have been visited to assist us with inquiries to help us locate the whereabouts of the stolen material.

We are working closely with Suffolk Coastal Environmental Health to address complaints from local residents regarding a local public house. We are continuing to work with the Suffolk Coastal and the licensee to address concerns raised.

Community engagement has taken place at Tesco's Saxmundham with the Suffolk Safe Key Team to promote the benefits of the Safe Key Scheme.

We have assisted CID with several ongoing investigations regarding a robbery and a burglary in Leiston by conducting house to house and CCTV inquiries throughout the town. An individual was arrested and charged for a burglary.

Following a non stop RTC in Leiston the SNT assisted NRT and detained the driver. The driver was later charged with driving otherwise in accordance with their license, having no insurance, fail to stop following an accident.

In the South of Norfolk thefts of lawn mowers and vehicle trailers have been reported. Although this may not be connected to your area, we are asking residents to security conscious and ensure that your property is locked and secure.

## Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone. There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that most matter to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

## How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

## Never leave an open invite!

Now that the warmer weather at lasts seems to have made an appearance there will be a tendency to leave windows open at home to let the breeze in. Be aware however that open windows can be seen as an opportunity for burglars, so please ensure that when going to bed vulnerable windows such as those downstairs, are shut. Also when leaving home check that you have closed and locked all your windows. Remember, Close it, Lock it, Check it.

## Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request. By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999. The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: [leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk](mailto:leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk)

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
