SNT has visited the sports centre & spoken with the Manager. CCTV enquiries have also been made in an effort to determine offences and identify drivers.

### Responding to issues in your community

On Sunday, July 29th, a car was driven past the automatic number plate recognition cameras (ANPR) on the A12 at Farnham and flagged to Police as stolen. The vehicle was intercepted and stopped by Halesworth officers, still on the A12, and the driver arrested. The vehicle was returned, undamaged, to the owner.

### Making the community safer

The police station on King's Rd. Leiston closed in July and a new office opened, incorporated into the fire station at 15, King George's Ave. The office will be used by Officers when in the area and as the base for the Leiston PCSO. The new facility will offer financial savings which can be diverted into front line operational resources.

### Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

There've been a number of incidents reported recently of a dog owner in Leiston town centre allowing his dog to be out of control, on occasion, attacking other dogs. The male responsible has been issued a Community Protection Notice warning letter, the first of a two stage process. The second stage is the issue of the CPN itself which incorporates a requirement to control the dog, breaching of which is a criminal offence.
