FURTHER INFORMATION

This month our team have been extremely busy dropping off leaflets and giving evacuation advice to many homes in Reydon, Southwold, Aldeburgh and Snape due to the expected tidal surge. The expected flood area was extremely large with numerous properties being very remote and quite some distance inland. I am pleased to say that the tidal surge was nowhere near what was expected and thanks to improved flood defences and education, we got off very lightly.

The team continues to address reports of anti-social behaviour at the new skate park in Saxmundham, with no further incidents to date. We attended a meeting at the Market Hall with partner agencies, including Zoe Botten of the SCDC ASB Team, to discuss issues in area, ongoing proposals for skatepark and youth provision. Further meetings to be held.

Due to a rise in complaints of parking offences, Pcsos Taylor and Hassler have increased patrols in Framlingham. To date 13 tickets and 4 Verbal warnings have been issued. Pcsos Hassler will be committing more time to the town, linking in with Framlingham Town Council.

Pcsos 3034 Hassler is to target dangerous and illegal parking by parents who are dropping off their children at the Sir Robert Hitcham's Primary School in Framlingham. Pcsos Hassler will work with the school to address this issue.




Pcsos 3070 Taylor will be monitoring parking outside Leiston Primary School. A number of reports have been received to suggest parents/guardians are parking illegally when dropping their children off at school.

Pcsos Taylor and Hassler continue to carry out speed checks in the area, in particular Hacheston and Snape.

The Town Pastors have now officially launched in Leiston. Carol Cotton and her team have carried out a number of patrols and on one occasion have come to the aid of a young female, who needed their help. They have received positive feedback from residents and are looking at the possibility of expanding their town route.

Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone. There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

Crime Prevention Advice

We are reminding vehicle owners to make sure their vehicles are left locked when they are parked whether that's in public or within private grounds. Please also make sure that you do not leave any valuables on show which would attract the attention of anyone wishing to steal. If you do wish to discuss crime prevention advice or find out more about how you can mark your property then please contact the local SNT team.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request. By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
