FURTHER INFORMATION

In previous newsletters we have looked at the new SNT PCSO roles and which officers are assigned to them. This month we inform you of what our team has been working on.

PCSO 3070 Thora Taylor is responsible for Mental Health and as such has been working with the Waveney Mental Health Co-ordinator to help provide support to a vulnerable adult in the area.

Our team has also been working with local residents and partner agencies regarding ASB related incidents in the Leiston area. We have assisted housing providers in addressing a range of neighbour disputes in Leiston and victims of ASB have been supported whilst our team continues to work with partner agencies to resolve the issues.

Due to concerns about ASB in the Framlingham skate park we have patrolled the area and engaged with local youths. We have been visible and supported the local residents.

Our team have been dealing with parking infringements in Aldeburgh, Leiston, Saxmundham and Framlingham. A report of a vehicle being parked dangerously was investigated and has now been addressed. Our team have dealt with the parking issues by issuing enforcement tickets as well as words of advice to others.

Our team have implemented a new Community Speedwatch Scheme in Lower Hacheston in partnership with Hacheston and Parham.

Our team have conducted speed monitoring in Aldeburgh. A number of drivers were recorded over the limit and warning letters have been sent to those drivers involved.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Our team have conducted patrols at the disused caravan park in Leiston where it was reported ASB was taking place. These patrols will continue, whilst the team work with the land owners to prevent further issues.

PCSO 3111 Kevin Mann is the match funded PCSO for Aldeburgh. He has assisted Flagship Housing Association to deal with a report of ASB in Aldeburgh. This has resulted in Flagship working with their tenants to reduce incidents of ASB.

The team have assisted CID following a burglary at a home in Leiston, good use of local officers knowledge helped to locate the offender. He was remanded pending a court hearing scheduled for July.

Crime Prevention Advice

We ask the community to be security minded. Whilst we enjoy living in a low crime area, we are still experiencing burglaries from outbuildings as well as dwellings and also theft related offences. We ask that you ensure your property and vehicles are secure when you leave them. All valuables to be kept in a secure place, out of view from any potential thief. Should you wish for any crime prevention advice, please contact the team. We are more than happy to arrange a time to meet with you.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999. The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
