Anti Social Behaviour at the Skate Park in Saxmundham.

WE DID...

Criminal Damage - Two youth offenders have been interviewed and reported to Youth Magistrates Court having been identified for causing damage to a dwelling.

Anti Social Behaviour - Patrols and reports of ASB at the local skate park have resulted in a number of youths being identified, they have been spoken with parents present receiving their first of 3 strikes in a program to ban repeat offenders from the area.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Your team has been involved with a number of incidents and continue to target local issues. Below is a summary of work carried out during April.

CRIME

- Investigations have taken place into a number of small fires at the skate park, work to identify the people responsible continues. - SAX
- Reports have been made of an individual trying car door handles. Work in continuing to establish the identity of the individual. - LEI
- We are working with the SCDC Dangerous Dog Officer regarding several incidents reported. - LEI/SAX
- A Community Engagement Crime reduction event took place at Waitrose to promote home security and how to mark property. - SAX
- The team attended a Neighbourhood watch meeting – ALDE

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

- Youths responsible for ASB offences have been identified and warnings have been given in front of parents. - LEI
- Joint licensing visits and late night check of licensed premises have been carried out. These will continue in the area. - SAX
- Ongoing work with partner agencies, to discuss ways to engage with young people and reduce ASB. - SAX
- Ongoing work with Flagship Housing has continued to address neighbourhood related disputes - LEI

VULNERABLE PEOPLE

- A visit took place at the request of a school to address safeguarding concerns. - FRAM
- The team continues to work with the Domestic Violence team to support victims of DV. - ALL AREAS
- The team has been working with Social Services to support vulnerable families at risk. – SAX
- We have been liaising with Children and Young People Services regarding vulnerable young females – LEI
- Work has continued with Social Services to support vulnerable elderly people living alone – LEI/ALDE

SPEEDING

Various speeding hot spots continue to be targeted by the team. A new location in Friston has been added to our list.

- 3 drivers spoken to and warned
- 3 drivers reported for offences.

PARKING

- We have conducted patrols in High streets and outside Schools to monitor parking related problems – ALDE/LEI/SAX/FRAM
- The team is working with Suffolk Highways and Aldeburgh Town Council to improve single and double yellow lines and white parking bay lines in the High Street from Victoria Road to Crespigny Road. - ALDE.

Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone.

There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

Crime Prevention Advice

Tips to secure your outbuildings:

- Avoid storing valuable items like power tools and sporting equipment like fishing rods and golf clubs in your shed. These should be kept inside your home or in a secure garage.
- Chain items such as bicycles, ladders and lawnmowers to a strong anchor point or to each other using a closed shackle padlock.
- Register your property at www.immobolise.com which is a free web-based property registration service.
- Remember to lock your shed or garage after use.
- Secure shed doors by fitting a strong hasp and staple (or 'padbad'). Secure this with coach bolts and lock the hasp over the staple with a closed shackle padlock.
- Secure shed door hinges with coach bolts of non-returnable screws (screws which can only be screwed in and not back out again).
- Replace any rotten door or window frames.
- Fit a good quality battery-operated alarm to your outbuilding.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
