FURTHER INFORMATION

Our work to address the Drug and ASB related issues within Leiston has continued during October. Various individuals have been stopped and searched using powers under the Misuse of drugs act. One individual was found in possession of drugs and arrested. They were bailed pending further inquiries into the matter

This month saw one individual from Leiston charged and remanded for the offence of possession with the intent to supply drugs.

Our team has also continued addressing ASB within the town of Leiston. A few individuals from the group have now moved away from the area. Four members of the remaining group are now being managed under the youth offending diversion programme which will help direct individuals away from criminality.

In the lead up to Halloween our team visited both primary and secondary schools and reassured youths concerning the issue of clowns. Whilst at the school the team gave an input on behaving over Halloween and staying safe over the dark nights.




A small group of youths have been identified stealing and throwing eggs at a particular address in Leiston. Our team will be dealing with those responsible.

One of our response teams took part in a pro-active day on the 8th of October. As a result of the day various drivers were spoken with, tickets were issued and a drivers vehicle seized for having no insurance. This pro-active day focused Leiston, Saxmundham, Bramfield, Theberton, Yoxford and Spexhall.

Following reports of ASB in the skate park at Framlingham our team are now working to identify those that are responsible. We are also working with the local school and the local council to address the issue.

Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone. There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

Crime Protection Advice

Don't get caught out this Christmas...

Avoid leaving presents and valuables on view – it's a temptation for opportunist thieves.

If you know you are going to be out during the hours of darkness take steps to make your home appear occupied. Leave lights on or set lights on a timer to go on and off as your normal routine.

Avoid keeping large amounts of cash at home.

If you are going away ask neighbours to help. Ask them to close curtains, remove post and put the bins out.

Never leave keys in the locks. Keep your keys in a safe place out of view and away from your doors.

Dispose of gift packaging carefully. Make sure you only put your rubbish out just before collection and do your best to fold boxes to avoid advertising your new purchases.

Never leave spare keys hidden outside or hanging inside the letterbox as they will most likely be found.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
