### Responding to issues in your community

Your Safer Neighbourhood team has received a number of complaints recently about an irresponsible dog owner in Leiston. Mention was made of this in last months' newsletter. Since then, the individual has been monitored and further offences recorded. Targeted training has been provided to PCSOs specifically about offences involving guide dogs.
