## Crime Prevention

With the summer holidays approaching many of you will be heading to our beautiful local beach. Beach huts are enjoyed by many of you but when no-one is around they can fall victim to break-ins, so here are a few tips to help you secure your property.

Do - Always lock your doors with a good quality closed shackle padlock.

Do - Security mark any property left inside

Don't - Leave any valuables inside. Take them away with you.

Don't - Leave alcohol inside. If this is seen it may be reason for someone to break in.

You could consider fitting an alarm. Solar powered alarms are now available that can react to movement and when triggered emit a loud warning alarm and can also send an automated text message to your mobile.

If you are a boat owner, you can take simple steps to reduce the chances of being a victim of crime. It doesn't take much to improve your security and it needn't be expensive. Boatshield is a way of ensuring that everybody, including thieves, knows that you have taken steps to secure your boat and the equipment on it. If you elect to sign up to the Boatshield scheme you will become part of an initiative that strives to educate boat-owners about trends in marine offences and will keep you updated in security products and techniques to help you protect your property on the water.

## Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately. The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999. The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: [lowestoft.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk](mailto:lowestoft.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk)

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Richard Hill, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Hill will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.

## Crime Data.

We are no longer in a position to provide specific crime information for every parish in advance of your meetings. The information that is provided in our newsletters will be across the locality, broken down across each SNT. I appreciate that this will not be at parish level. However, you will see from the format of the newsletter that if we are concerned about some specific crimes in local areas, we will be able to raise this and give further information in the free-text section. Also, if you have concerns regarding crimes in your parish that you are aware of, please contact your local SNT in advance of your meeting and discuss it with them.
