This month, the Safer Neighbourhood Teams in the area combined forces and acted on the anti-social driving of quad and off road bikes. Due to the support from members of the public, officers were able to act on intelligence and patrol areas that were mentioned. Units from Halesworth, Beccles and Lowestoft managed to locate 3 drivers. The 3 drivers were stopped in Kessingland where 1 was arrested and 3 vehicles seized. The Police received great support from the public in this matter which certainly helped to achieve this outcome.

The weekend of the 27th and 28th saw the town centre of Lowestoft host a 1940's event. PCSO Holland, PCSO Leach and a number of Special Constables patrolled the event and joined in with the fun! Members of the public were in good spirits and enjoyed the 1940's music, classic cars and 1940's military personnel.

PCSO Dennington and PCSO Sandeno have been working with partner agencies regarding the traveller encampments within the Lowestoft area. Reassurance was given to the local communities and protocols were followed to ensure that the travellers left locations peacefully. PCSO Dennington also attended a modern day slavery awareness conference with sergeant Meen. Delegates from all over the UK were in attendance including Norfolk and Suffolk's PCC's Tim Passmore and Lorne Green.

PCSO Winn and PCSO Wicks visited Grove Primary School before the holidays and did a day's input about what it is like to work for the Police. Pupils were really excited to speak to the officers and hear all the stories they had to tell! PCSO Winn and PCSO Wicks enjoyed their time at the school and explained it was really good to see so many young people interested in the police and asking so many great questions.

## SUMMER DRINK AND DRUG DRIVING CAMPAIGNS

We are all aware of the danger created by those who drive or ride vehicles after consuming alcohol or using drugs, not only to themselves but also to other road users.

Norfolk and Suffolk Constabulary will continue to support both the National NPCC Summer Drink and Drug Driving Campaign and the TISPOL European Campaign, by cracking down on those that flout the law, with a view to reducing the number of casualties on our roads.

The TISPOL campaign will run from Monday 5 June to Sunday 11 June 2017. The NPCC campaign will run from Thursday 1 June to Friday 30 June 2017.

The purpose of this national Summer Drink Drug Driving Operation is to draw drivers' attention to not only the risks posed by drink/drug driving while in control of a vehicle, but the serious penalties which they will face if they are caught. Collisions caused by drink and drug driving regularly result in serious injuries and deaths on our roads.

Many drivers continue to ignore the risks and drive their vehicle after drinking alcohol or taking illegal drugs. Despite the recent fall in drink-driving convictions, the harm caused by those who still drink-drive is in fact increasing. Combining illegal drugs with alcohol is especially deadly since it has been found that drivers who have consumed both are 23 times more likely to be involved in a fatal crash than sober drivers.
