OPERATIONS

We executed a positive drugs warrant in the Pakefield ward this month.

Road checks carried out in Lowestoft in support of a Europe-wide campaign to reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured on the roads. Police in both Suffolk and Norfolk have been carrying out checks across the counties during the day and there was a targeted operation in Lowestoft as part of Project Edward – European Day Without A Road Death - a campaign by TISPOL, the European Traffic Police Network, which aims to get people thinking seriously about road safety.
As a result of the day –

Three men were arrested on suspicion of drug driving after three of six drugs tests administered were positive – two for cannabis and one for cocaine.

30 people were dealt with for not wearing a seatbelt.

16 people were found driving while using a mobile phone

Three people were caught driving with no insurance

Two vehicles were seized

Five drivers were found to have no MoT for their vehicle

Two were caught driving with no licence

HALLOWEEN - Suffolk Police wants everyone in the county to have a 'fang'tastic time at Halloween

Halloween is fast approaching which can be lots of fun for trick or treaters. However not everybody would like to be involved so we ask if you take your children out please respect households which would prefer peace and quiet.

If you look on the Suffolk Constabulary website there will be posters you can download, print and display in your window either inviting trick or treaters or alternatively requesting not to be disturbed.

A plea to parents - if your children are going out unsupervised, please make sure they are not taking your eggs and flour with them! Unfortunately some spoil the Halloween experience for others.

Top Tips for Trick or Treaters:

- Always be accompanied by an adult when you are trick-or-treating.
- You should only go to houses of people you know and who are happy for you to call. Don't call at houses that have 'No trick or treat' posters on show. There may be elderly or vulnerable people living at these addresses who do not feel comfortable speaking to strangers.
- Stay safe, keep to places that you know and are well lit. Do not take shortcuts through gardens, alleyways or parks.
- Watch out for traffic - drivers might not see you.
- If you are wearing a mask make sure that you can see where you are going and are aware of your surroundings.
- Carry a torch and a fully charged mobile phone (if you have one). If you take one, keep it hidden from view and only use it if absolutely necessary.
- Never go inside someone's house – only accept treats on the doorstep.
- Always be respectful when you are calling at someone's door.
- Have fun, but have respect for others and do not damage property. Anti-social behaviour can result in a criminal record.
- Consider placing reflective or glow-in-the dark tape on your children's costumes.
- Set a time for children to get back, and make sure you know who they are with.
- Know where your children are trick-or-treating.

Householders:

- You don't have to answer the door to unknown callers.
- Use your spyhole, look out of a window, and use your door chain if you do decide to open your door.
- Have a contact number of a close relative or good neighbour to hand by your telephone, just in case you need to call them.
- If you are going to be on your own and feel vulnerable, let a family member, relative or friend know, so they can make contact to check you are okay.
- If trick-or-treaters do call on you and things get out of hand, or you feel intimidated, contact the police.
