STAY SAFE SCHEME

Pcso Paul Dennington (our Vulnerable Communities PCSO) is currently working on promoting the Stay Safe scheme. The Stay Safe scheme is aimed at any vulnerable person who may find themselves out in public and become in need of help. Some vulnerable people can become confused or are unable to communicate sufficiently to explain who they are, what is wrong and who to call. That's where Stay Safe comes in!

Vulnerable people can carry a Stay Safe card on their person; the card has their name, relevant medical issues and some contact details of who to ring if there is a problem. So if that person finds themselves in a situation such as being confused and lost; other people whether it's the police, ambulance or even a member of the public or shop worker can use the Stay Safe card to know who they are speaking with, understand what the problem may be and who to call to help - which could be a family member or care home etc

In August Pcso Dennington visited Church Green to promote the scheme and handed out some of the Stay Safe cards. He will also be at the WDC Scoot Safe event on 16th September held in the town center, London Road North, where he will be on hand to speak about the scheme and will have some Stay Safe cards to give out. So why not come along and speak to him about this if you think you or someone you know would benefit from the scheme?

SNT SUCCESS

We received some reports of Anti-Social Behavior and linked criminal offences occurring in the Harbour ward. The Lowestoft SNT responded with conducting patrols in the area, identified those responsible and investigated various offences such as Racially aggravated harassment, alarm or distress; Sec 4a POA Causing intentional harassment, alarm or distress; common assault, theft and criminal damage. Three youths have so far been identified and have been referred through to the Youth Offending Team.

CHURCH LEAD THEFT

Rural churches are often targeted due to their isolated locations so members of the public are asked to report any suspicious activity they see. Stealing a large amount of lead takes time and a reasonably large vehicle to transport it, so any early reports will assist police in locating offenders.

Chief Inspector Matt Rose said "We are asking local people to take an interest in their local church whilst they are out and about. If you take the dog out for a walk, or go for a stroll, don't ignore anything that you think looks out of place - report anything you think may be suspicious to the police. Communities can act as our eyes and ears, and by pulling together to note suspicious activity, we can deter thieves and help keep these historic buildings safe"

OUTBOARD SECURITY

Outboards are one of the prime targets for thieves and it is extremely important to have your outboard motor properly secured to the transom of your boat. Most insurance policies dictate that outboards must be securely attached to the craft using an outboard motor lock or another anti-theft device.
