The new PCSO'S will be taking up their new roles, where there will become Specific points of contact for the areas of Anti-social behaviour, Domestic Abuse and Chronically excluded / Marginalised communities.

Praise for Suffolk by HMIC Inspectorate

Suffolk Constabulary has been recognised as performing well after an inspection report published by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabularies (HMIC) on Thursday 2 March 2017.

The force received an overall 'good' grading in the 2016 PEEL* inspections into effectiveness, which looks at how well the force keeps people safe and reduces crime.


The force was graded as 'good' in all four areas of the assessment. These were effectiveness at preventing crime, tackling anti-social behaviour and keeping people safe; investigating crime and reducing offending; protecting those who are vulnerable from harm and supporting victims and tackling serious and organised crime.

PCSO Bixley has been working with Trading Standards to get a 'No Cold Calling Zone' implemented in the area of Mitchell Avenue and Severn Road. No Cold Calling Zones are specific geographical areas where residents have identified that they don't want visits from unsolicited or 'cold' callers, and used in the spirit of crime prevention or reduction, or reducing the fear of crime.

Suffolk Police are launching a New Year #CouldYouBeSpecial campaign to attract recruits into the Special Constabulary. Being a member of the Special Constabulary opens up a range of special opportunities; to volunteer, to connect with your community, to get new skills, to extend your personal limits, to reduce harm, to inspire others to join, to make others and yourself proud of what you a difference you can make.
