UPDATE ON CRIME DATA:

Crime data is for May 2017. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

LOCAL POLICING NEWS:

Acting on information received the team supported by response officers executed a drugs warrant at an address in Mildenhall, with some positive results. A substantial amount of money, along with drugs were seized, resulting in the arrest and subsequent charge of a male for drug related offences. I would like to thank the public for their continued support in fighting drugs and other criminal activities, without information from the public it would be difficult to identify offender and this has shown the importance of the link between the Police and the community which it serves.

The local SNT officers and members of the Mildenhall Police Cadets were busy this month when they held a charity car wash event down at the Jubilee Car Park. It was a hot day and lots of people donated to the East Anglian Childrens Hospice to have their cars washed and cleaned. In total over £250 was raised, so a big thank you for supporting the event.

The local officers were also kept busy at the Lakenheath School Fete, which was well attended and the young people certainly kept the team busy with lots of questions, as well as crawling around the police vehicle taken down.

PCSO Bob Bailey has been attending the schools during the month of June to deliver an input around Cyber Safety to all the young children that attend.


Officers continue to carry out sporadic parking patrols of the Town at this time to deal with areas particularly troubled by the problem of illegal/unsafe parking. If you believe a particular street deserves our attention then please let us know by contacting us below and we will look to carry out some enforcement when other operational issues allow.
