## UPDATE ON CRIME DATA:

Crime data is for June 2017. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

## LOCAL POLICING NEWS:

The Safer Neighbourhood Team have been busy this month working with partner agencies to make Icewell Hill Flats a safer place to live and to date have now received the names of 7 residents who want to be part of setting up its very first resident committee, supported by the local councillor for the area.

Acting on information received the team supported by response officers executed a drugs warrant at an address in Newmarket, with some positive results. A substantial amount of money, along with drugs were seized, resulting in the arrest and subsequent charge of a male for drug related offences. I would like to thank the public for their continue support in fighting drugs and other criminal activities, without information from the public it would be difficult to identify offender and this has shown the importance of the link between the Police and the community which it serves.

The team continue to work and liaise with the Rough Sleeper Coordinator from West Suffolk Council, whilst it has been recognised as an issue this is a process that takes time from all parties involved including the victim of these circumstances.

Officers continue to carry out sporadic parking patrols of the Town at this time to deal with areas particularly troubled by the problem of illegal/unsafe parking. If you believe a particular street deserves our attention then please let us know by contacting us below and we will look to carry out some enforcement when other operational issues allow.

And finishing with a good bit of news, I would like to congratulate PCSO Allen who will be leaving us in August to pursue her aspiration of becoming a Police Constable, having been successful in the recruitment process. We wish her well in her new role as a police recruit in Suffolk Constabulary.

## OTHER NEWS:

Suffolk's Police and Crime Commissioner, Tim Passmore continues his 2017 series of public meetings across the county. He will be visiting Newmarket on Thursday 28th September, at Newmarket Academy, Exning Road, Newmarket, CB8 OEB.

Following the successful format of last year, the PCC will stage a meeting in each of the 18 Safer Neighbourhood areas. The meetings are an opportunity for the public to ask questions of the Commissioner and the Constabulary, and to find out more about policing in the county.

Each meeting will involve a quick overview from Tim Passmore and the local Inspector and then the public will have an opportunity to ask questions. The local Superintendent responsible for policing in the local area, will add operational context. There is no need to book, please just turn up. Tea and coffee will be served from 6.40pm.

## SECURITY AND PROPERTY ADVICE:

As the Summer months are now upon us and the weather continues to improve, we would ask again that people make sure that all doors, gates, windows etc. on houses, sheds, outbuildings are secure and that cars and vans are locked when not being used. A large percentages of burglary and theft from motor vehicles reports we receive are due to opportunists finding insecurities.
