The team continue to work with Security and Retailers of the Guineas shopping Centre to address the concerns of ASB and criminal behaviour.

The team continue to carry out snap speed enforcement within areas reported as having an issue around Newmarket.

### Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Reports of travellers encamped on Willie Snaithe Road causing concerns were dealt with. Landowners had to seek a court eviction which was executed by Bailiffs after a couple of weeks. Local police will continue to work with the Council to try to come up with a plan to speed up evictions for the future.
