Between 1st March - 31st March 2017 there have been 354 incidents and 132 investigations within the 4 wards that make up the Brandon SNT area. Many of the investigations relate to theft along with adult/child and mental health referrals. Figures below relate to crime categories from the Police and Crime Plan only.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

Following an increase in motor vehicle crime over the past month which has included theft from and off motor vehicles.

Vehicle owners should follow the following advice:

- Don't leave anything on display in your car - even a plastic bag can be enticing to a criminal
- Take your car keys to bed with you. Lock all your home doors and windows.
- Take your belongings with you when you leave the car - if you can't, lock them in the boot before you start your journey
- Fit an electronic immobiliser- this will prevent the car from starting
- Mechanical immobilisers, such as steering wheel locks, are a good alternative to electronic immobilisers
- Fit locking wheel nuts
- Get an alarm installed
- Mark all your valuables that you frequently take in your car
- Lock all doors and close windows and the sun roof every time you leave your car unattended
- If you have a garage, use it. If you not always try and park in a well lit open place

## PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY

The effectiveness of investing in home security has recently been highlighted in Bury St Edmunds in an attempted burglary that has resulted in the arrest of a prolific burglar. The home owner in question had fitted a video enabled door bell. This sent a message to his phone alerting them that someone was at the his door of his house and streamed a video of the person, in this case trying to break in. The police were alerted and on viewing the video footage were able to identify the offender and make an arrest.
