FUTURE EVENTS

SNT officers will be attending engagements (subject to operational commitments) with: Mildenhall police cadets on the 3rd, 12 & 17th December at St Marys school in Mildenhall. If you are interested in either becoming a cadet or a volunteer leader please contact the Mildenhall SNT office.

Parking enforcement once per week for 4 hours across the area. There will be licensed premises checks carried out across the area during December and Officers will be on patrol in Mildenhall town center in the run up to Christmas.



FURTHER INFORMATION

Between the 1st and the 30th November 2016 there have been 356 incidents and 104 investigations within the 6 wards that make up the Mildenhall SNT area. The majority of the investigations come from theft, non dwelling burglary (ie commercial premises or garage and shed breaks) and child/adult/domestic safeguarding related investigations.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1ST-30TH NOVEMBER 2016

Figures for wards are provided in line with the Suffolk Police and crime plan priorities.

Great Heath

There have been 29 investigations recorded.

Of these there has been 1 dwelling burglary, 2 violence with injury and 1 drug offence. The remaining investigations comprise of criminal damage, make off without payment, arson, malicious communications, public order, interference with motor vehicle and a number of adult and child safeguarding investigations.

Market

There have been 24 investigations recorded.

Of these there has been 2 violence with injury and 1 drug offence. The remaining investigations comprise of theft, public order, non dwelling burglary, arson and a number of adult and child safeguarding investigations.

Iceni

There have been 4 investigations recorded.

Of these there has been 1 injury with violence. The remaining investigations comprise of dangerous dogs, criminal damage and an adult safeguarding investigation.

Manor

There have been 15 investigation recorded.

Of these there has been 3 violence with injury. The remaining investigations comprise of non dwelling burglary, make off without payment, death by dangerous driving, theft and public order.

Red Lodge

There have been 25 investigations recorded.


Of these there has been 4 violence with injury. The remaining investigations comprise of non dwelling burglary, theft, criminal damage, indecent images of children, harassment and a number of adult and child safeguarding investigations.

FURTHER INFORMATION

There have been 9 investigations recorded.

Of these there has not been any covered by the Suffolk Police and crime plan, the remaining investigations comprise of indecent photographs, criminal damage, theft, harassment, hunting act offenses and adult safeguarding investigations.

Research recently carried out across the Western Area has seen a rise in Theft from Person and in particular Bag Dippers. Please see the below advice issued by Suffolk Constabulary community safety:

Pickpockets' top tactics

Familiarise yourself with pickpockets' tactics and avoid becoming a victim.

- Single "dip" into a bag, operating under cover of a jacket, newspaper or bag
- A group surround and jostle the target
- Distraction – spill a drink, apologise and then steal the target's property
- Bag slasher – teams of two to four surround the target and cut the strap of the bag or slit the bag itself.

How to beat pickpockets

- Keep purses secure and carry wallets in an inside pocket.
- Zip up hand and shoulder bags.
- Carry bags in front of you with flaps against your body.
- Keep straps short and bags tucked under your arm.
- Don't display jewellery.
- Don't show your money — keep it safely in your pocket.
- Don't leave valuable items unattended
- Ensure any bags placed on the on the floor are in front of you so that any movement of the bag will be noticeable.

Protect Gadgets

- Install a tracker application on your smartphone, which could help trace your device if it's stolen.
- Stay alert and aware of what's going on around you when using your phone in public.
- Keep a record of the unique reference number (IMEI) on your mobile phone. To get this, dial *#06#.
- Always use your phone's security lock or PIN number.
- Use an ultra violet property marker to write your post code and house number on valuable possessions.
- Insure your possessions and keep the insurance details handy.
