FURTHER INFORMATION

Mildenhall Safer Neighbourhood Team area has had 78 investigations recorded during May. Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also investigations into:

Safeguarding individuals and intelligence reports. In the near future we hope to be able to provide more detailed crime statistics.

The majority of investigation recorded come under Burglary/Theft, Assaultive behaviour - GBH, ABH, Common assault with or without injury and Vulnerable Adult and Child referrals to our specialist department.

Iceni has had 9 investigations recorded; 4 have been Adult/Child referral to our Safeguarding hub. The remainder are made up of Domestic Abuse, Breach of restraining order and Theft of a motor vehicle.

Manor has had 11 investigations recorded; There is no one crime more prevalent than the others within this period. They range from Theft by employee, Adult/ Child referral, Assault ABH and Make off without payment.

Market has had 27 investigations recorded; 7 Assaults with or without injury predominantly features. The remainder being made up of Domestic Abuse, Adult & Child referrals to our Safeguarding unit and theft.

Red Lodge has had 27 investigation recorded; 6 thefts from motor vehicle with satnavs, cash and other personal items being targeted. 5 child referrals to our Safeguarding unit and the remainder covering Domestic Abuse, Assault with and without injury and Harassment.

South has had 2 investigations recorded; Both have been safeguarding referrals.

Great Heath has had 26 investigation recorded; 6 have been Domestic Abuse related, 5 have been Assaults ABH and the remainder made up of Harassment and Child Safeguarding referrals.

Suffolk Constabulary are keenly aware that we have not published any crime and event data in April, May and now June. The reasons for this revolve around our ICT system which has not been performing as we would have wanted recently and we cannot currently guarantee the accuracy of the data we might publish. We have therefore made the decision not to publish data at this time rather than publish misleading data and misrepresent the true situation, either positively or negatively. We know this is frustrating for communities. Our ICT team are working very hard to rectify this situation and have given assurances the situation will soon be resolved. Sorting this out is a priority for us and we offer our apologies at this time for the situation. When it is rectified we will be able to publish both current and historic (i.e. April/May + June) data as required. We hope normal service will soon be restored!
