# FURTHER INFORMATION

Between 1st February - 28th February 2017 there have been 322 incidents and 115 investigations within the 6 wards that make up the Mildenhall SNT area. Many of the investigations relate to thefts, criminal damage, minor assaults with no injury and adult/child referral investigations.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

With Spring on its way and thoughts turning to outside projects we would just like to remind everyone about Garden Shed and Garage security.

Criminals are not only interested in the property in your house.

They can also be tempted by goods and equipment stored outside in garages, sheds and even the garden.

Property such as bicycles, lawnmowers and power tools can be just as valuable as televisions, stereos and dvd players.

However a few simple steps can help keep equipment safe while deterring thieves and burglars.

Garages, sheds and other outbuildings.

Ensure that the building is in good condition and look to improve security by:-

1. Fixing mesh or bars on the inside of windows
2. Fitting good locks to all doors. Padlocks should be at least 6cm/2.5 ins wide, hardened steel, have at least 5 pins and be close shackled type.
3. Fittings should be bolted through the door and reinforced at the back with a steel plate or washer; hasps should have concealed screws.
4. Fitting additional locks to up-and-over garage doors.
5. Considering an alarm - either a battery-operated alarm or upgraded house alarm which includes the garage or shed.

It is important to use locks at all time, even if you are at home.

Always keep keys safe and out of sight.

Property

1. Secure all items that could be easily removed - they could be used to break into your house.
2. Security mark property such as lawn mowers, furniture and tools with your postcode and advertise the fact that they are marked. Keep a note of serial/make/model numbers.
3. Take photographs of any valuable garden ornaments.
4. Ensure bicycles are security marked.

Outside

1. Consider installing security lights to both illuminate your garden and deter thieves.
2. Keep shrubs, bushes, hedges cut back as they can provide a hiding place for thieves.
3. Check that all boundary fences, walls and gates are in good repair.

And finally if you are at all suspicious of anyone call the police immediately.
