FURTHER INFORMATION

Between 1st - 31st October 2016 there have been 334 incidents and 125 investigations within the 6 wards that make up Mildenhall, Cavenham, Higham, Tuddenham, Icklingham, Gazeley, Barton Mills, Worlington, Freckenham, Red Lodge, Herringswell, Kentford and Dalham Parishes.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1ST - 31 October 2016

Great Heath

There have been 27 investigations recorded which consist of 5 assaults. The remainder are theft type offenses, harassment, criminal damage, stalking and vulnerable child and adult referrals.

Market

There have been 46 investigations recorded which consist of 8 assaults and 1 drug offence. The remainder are theft type offenses, harassment, malicious communications, child cruelty and vulnerable child and adult referrals.

Iceni

There has been 1 investigation recorded which was an assault

Manor

There have been 15 investigations recorded which consist of 3 assaults and 1 sex offence. The remainder are theft type offenses, criminal damage and vulnerable child, adult and mental health referrals.

Red Lodge

There have been 32 investigations recorded which consist of 4 assaults and a dwelling burglary. The remainder are theft type offenses, public order offenses, harassment, adult and child referrals.

South

There have been 4 investigations recorded with 1 assault and the remainder are theft type offenses.

FURTHER INFORMATION

There has been a rise in the number of theft from motor vehicles during October particularly targeting Catalytic Converters. Our offenders prefer to work in the quiet hours and are specifically targeting Honda's. There is quite a big market for catalytic converters and whilst we work to build up the intelligence picture around this specific crime series we are urging the public to be alert to this crime and take preventative measures to secure your vehicle, especially if it is a Honda. Please see the below advice:

Police are warning all vehicle owners that there has been a series of recent thefts of catalytic converters in areas of West Suffolk - including Eriswell, Lakenheath, Bury St Edmunds, Red Lodge, and Haverhill. Commercial vehicles and 4 wheel drives are particularly at risk because the higher ground clearance allows easier access for the criminals who target them.

To reduce the likelihood of becoming a victim:

- Garage your car whenever possible
- Park in well-lit, busy areas
- Look out for people working under cars
- If the vehicle is high risk, consider marking the metal shell of the converter with a unique mark, so that if it is removed by thieves it will be easier to trace back to your vehicle. Various marking methods are commercially available.
- If you operate a small fleet, consider obstructing access to vehicles with high ground clearance, by parking lower vehicles close by

If you have any information that may assist police, call 101. In an emergency or where immediate response is required always call 999.

Your SNT officers do hold catalytic converter marking sessions and these are published on our website, The next session will be the 7th November at ATS on the Mildenhall Industrial site.
