FURTHER INFORMATION

Between 1st - 30th November 2016 there have been 465 incidents and 166 investigations within the 4 wards that make up Newmarket and Exning Parishes. The majority of investigations recorded come under Theft from the retail outlets within the Town, Public Order and Assaultive behavior linked to the Night Time Economy (NTE) GBH, ABH, Common assault with or without injury and Vulnerable Adult and Child referrals to our specialised department. There has been 1 robbery and several drug related offences resulting in arrests of persons.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1ST - 30 November 2016

St Mary's

42 investigations: 6 assaults - minor wound & ABH. 6 theft related - theft from person & shops. 6 domestic abuse investigations & 3 adult & child safeguarding referrals. 1 dwelling burglary and 3 burglary other building with the remainder being made up of other investigation types.

All Saints

37 Investigations: 11 theft related including theft from person, shops & motor vehicle. 8 assaults including GBH and ABH. 3 having a controlled drug. 1 false imprisonment. 1 robbery. The remainder being made up of other investigation types.

Severals

81 Investigations: 22 theft related including theft from person, shops, motor vehicle and make off without payment. 8 assaults of GBH & ABH. 6 domestic abuse. 6 criminal damage to vehicle or building. 6 domestic abuse investigations. The remainder being made up of other investigation types.

Exning

4 Investigations: 3 theft related - 1 Theft of foodstuffs from Londis shop. 1 theft of music equipment from illegal Rave in Seven Springs, Ducks Lane area. 1 theft of trailer from secure yard. 1 domestic abuse investigation.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Research recently carried out across the Western Area has seen a rise in Theft from Person and in particular Bag Dippers. Please see the below advice issued by Suffolk Constabulary community safety:

How to beat pickpockets

- Keep purses secure and carry wallets in an inside pocket.
- Zip up hand and shoulder bags.
- Carry bags in front of you with flaps against your body.
- Keep straps short and bags tucked under your arm.
- Don't display jewelery.
- Don't show your money — keep it safely in your pocket.
- Don't leave valuable items unattended
- Ensure any bags placed on the on the floor are in front of you so that any movement of the bag will be noticeable.

Protect Gadgets

- Install a tracker application on your smart-phone, which could help trace your device if it's stolen.
- Stay alert and aware of what's going on around you when using your phone in public.
- Keep a record of the unique reference number (IMEI) on your mobile phone. To get this, dial *#06#.
- Always use your phone's security lock or PIN number.
- Use an ultra violet property marker to write your post code and house number on valuable possessions.
- Insure your possessions and keep the insurance details handy.

On Wednesday 23rd November a police led multi agency check was carried out in Newmarket, where various traffic related offences were dealt with, along with 5 arrests were made for drug/driving offences.

Other Proactive Work:

1. Speed checks carried out on Snailwell Road during November resulted in 8 drivers being verbally warned.
2. Officers tasked with parking enforcement issued 14 Fixed Penalty Notices for parking violations in and around the Town Centre.
3. Community surgeries in the Guineas where officers issued Crime Prevention Advice, cat bells and purse lanyards.
