FUTURE EVENTS

SNT officers will be attending engagements (subject to operational commitments) with: Mildenhall police cadets on 4th, 11th, 18th & 25th February. Multi-agency surgery Icewell Hill 3/2/17 1100-1400. Speed checks Snailwell Road & Bury Road periodically throughout the month. Licensed premises checks throughout the month. Crime prevention stall at the Guineas between 10am-11am 7th & 21st. Parking enforcement once per week for 4 hours across the area. Supporting Junior Road Safety officers at schools throughout the month.



FURTHER INFORMATION

Between 1st - 31st January 2017 there have been 392 incidents and 138 investigations within the 4 wards that make up Newmarket and Exning Parishes. The majority of investigations recorded come under Theft from the retail outlets within the Town, Public Order and Assaultive behavior linked to the Night Time Economy (NTE) GBH, ABH, Common assault with or without injury and Vulnerable Adult and Child referrals to our specialised department.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1ST - 31st January 2017

St Mary's

40 investigations: 7 assaults - ABH. 3 theft shops. 5 domestic abuse investigations & 5 adult & child safeguarding referrals. 1 dwelling burglary. 1 Robbery. 1 Rape (female over 16.) 1 arson with intent to endanger life the remainder being made up of other investigation types.

All Saints

29 Investigations: 7 assaults ABH/common assault. 7 theft related including theft from person, shops & motor vehicle. 1 robbery & 2 attempted robbery. 2 Attempted burglary dwelling. 1 exposure and 2 domestic abuse. The remainder being made up of other investigation types.

Severals

61 Investigations: 4 assaults - GBH & ABH. 10 theft related including theft from person, shops or motor vehicle. 5 domestic abuse. 10 criminal damage to vehicle or building. 6 Burglary dwelling or other building. The remainder being made up of other investigation types.

8 Investigations: 4 theft from motor vehicle - 3 theft of number plates, 1 theft of fuel. 1 theft of trailer. 1 burglary other building - theft of bridle from a barn. 2 stalking/harassment.

This months editions is given over to the Forest Heath Volunteer Police Cadets unit, which launched on 28th May 2016 and recruits young people in the Forest Heath area.

The aims of the scheme are:

- to promote and encourage a practical interest in policing / emergency services work among young people
- to provide training which will encourage positive leadership within communities
- to encourage the spirit of adventure and develop qualities of leadership and good citizenship.

Current cadet units

There are currently nine cadet units, which are based in Martlesham, Ipswich, Bury St Edmunds, Lowestoft, Sudbury, Haverhill, Mildenhall, Stowmarket and Beccles. Young people who want to join one of these units must live in the area of the group they wish to join.

During the first 12-month period, cadets will follow a training and development programme.
