- \*Tackle drug dealing and use in the Town of Newmarket.
- \*ASB and Street Drinkers at the Guineas Shopping Centre.
- \*Cycling on pavements around Newmarket.

### WE DID...

- \* Subject to an on-going operation. Local officers continue to work with partners agencies in providing High Profile Patrols along with engagement with vulnerable persons identified. 3 arrests have been made with a quantity of drugs and cash recovered.
- \* To date 4 Community Protection Notice Warning Letters have been issued to individuals. Police continue to work with Guineas Security in dealing with offenders. CPN Order to be issued for breach of CPNWL.
- \*High profile patrols being carried out during peak times and Racing Yards in Newmarket being briefed of the offence's being committed by their staff.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

Newmarket Parish has had 133 investigations recorded during the month of June. Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also investigations into child and adult protection (safeguarding), mental health and anti social behavior.

The majority of investigations recorded come under Theft from the retails outlets within the Town, Public Order and Assaultive behavior linked to the Night Time Economy (NTE) GBH, ABH, Common assault with or without injury and Vulnerable Adult and Child referrals to our specialised department.

## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1ST - 30TH JUNE 2016

### SEVERALS

52 investigations: 15 theft related which cover from shops, person and motor vehicle. 10 assaults with and without injury, 5 domestic related, 6 adult/child & mental health referrals, 1 robbery & 1 rape. The remainder being made up of other.

### ALL SAINTS

26 investigations: 7 theft related includes theft from shop, person and going equipped to steal. 3 assaults with and without injury. 1 rape. 1 possession of a bladed and sharply point article in a public place. The remainder being made up of other.

### ST. MARY'S

42 Investigations: 13 theft related including theft from person, shops, motor vehicle and make off without payment. 5 adult & child safeguarding referrals. 4 criminal damage to vehicle and dwelling. 2 dwelling burglaries and 2 drunk and disorderly in a public place. The remainder being made up of other.

### EXNING

13 investigations: 4 theft related including theft from shops, motor vehicle and other. 4 domestic abuse and 3 child protection investigations. The remainder being made up of other.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

"Now that the new model of delivering your local policing is 3 months old we wanted to remind you of the many ways you can get in touch with us. Most importantly, if it's an emergency always ring 999. However, if it's not an emergency but you wish to report a crime or a concern for safety then use 101. If you simply wish to contact your local team, perhaps to tell us about Anti-Social Behavior (ASB) or a series of crimes occurring in your area, or to tell us about your concerns about how the police have handled a local community matter, why not in the first instance speak with your local Inspector and discuss the matter with them?"

Your local Inspector will be able to review the matter and make an assessment about how well we did, reporting back to you with their findings. Your local community inspector is Inspector Mark Shipton.

If you want to speak to your local officer and it's not urgent then an email will be quickest means to get in contact, and if you need a reply then a member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs.

Remember, the demand on 101 is very high and if you don't need to report a crime we would encourage the use of email.

Finally, our brand new and interactive website will be on-line in the Autumn which will give you direct access to your teams in a fast, secure format, as well as providing loads of really useful information!"
