FURTHER INFORMATION

Newmarket Parish has had 145 investigations recorded during May. Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offence's, but also investigations into:

Safeguarding individuals and intelligence reports. In the near future we hope to be able to provide more detailed crime statistics.

The majority of investigations recorded come under Theft from the retails outlets within the Town, Public Order and Assaultive behavior linked to the Night Time Economy (NTE) GBH, ABH, Common assault with or without injury and Vulnerable Adult and Child referrals to our specialised department.

Exning Parish has had 5 investigations recorded during May.

3 Assaults linked to Beech House, 1 Fraud and 1 Theft.

Officers have also carried out speed checks within the CSW area of Kentford. At the time of checking the majority of motorists adhered to the speed limit. However one motorist was recorded as doing 57mph in a 40mph zone. This motorist was reported for consideration of prosecution.

Suffolk Constabulary are keenly aware that we have not published any crime and event data in April, May and now June. The reasons for this revolve around our ICT system which has not been performing as we would have wanted recently and we cannot currently guarantee the accuracy of the data we might publish. We have therefore made the decision not to publish data at this time rather than publish misleading data and misrepresent the true situation, either positively or negatively. We know this is frustrating for communities. Our ICT team are working very hard to rectify this situation and have given assurances the situation will soon be resolved. Sorting this out is a priority for us and we offer our apologies at this time for the situation. When it is rectified we will be able to publish both current and historic (i.e. April/May + June) data as required. We hope normal service will soon be restored!
