FUTURE EVENTS

SNT officers will be attending engagements (subject to operational commitments) with: Mildenhall police cadets on 5th, 12th, 19th & 26th November. Speed checks Snailwell Road periodically throughout the month. Licensed premises checks 1st & 7th November. Multi-agency visit to Icewell Hill re ongoing project 8/11/16. Suffolk Safe Key 1st and 18th November - Waitrose between 10am-1pm. Parking enforcement 4 hours on a weekly basis across the area.

Tuesday 6th December - The Police and Crime Commissioner and Chief Constable will be hosting a public meeting in Newmarket. Your local Inspector will also be in attendance. The meeting will take place at Severals Sports Pavilion, Bury Rd, Newmarket, CB8 7BT from 6.30 pm until 9 pm. There will be presentations and an opportunity to ask questions about policing. (confirmed attendance)



FURTHER INFORMATION

Between 1st - 31st October 2016 there have been 363 incidents and 153 investigations within the 4 wards that make up Newmarket and Exning Parishes. The majority of investigations recorded come under Theft from retail outlets within the Town, Public Order and Assaultive behavior linked to the Night Time Economy (NTE) GBH, ABH, Common assault with or without injury and Vulnerable Adult and Child referrals to our specialised department. There have been 3 robberies this month and 1 rape.

WHT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1ST - 31 October 2016

St Mary's

35 investigations: 6 assaults GBH minor wound & ABH. 11 theft related including theft from person, shops, motor vehicle and make off without payment. 3 adult & child safeguarding referrals. 1 Arson with intent to endanger life and 3 criminal damage other with the remainder being made up of other investigation types.

All Saints

34 Investigations: 10 theft related including theft from person, shops & motor vehicle. 7 assaults including GBH and ABH. 3 having a controlled drug. 1 domestic abuse and 2 child referrals. The remainder being made up of other investigation types.

Severals

75 Investigations: 27 theft related including theft from person, shops, motor vehicle and make off without payment. 9 assaults of GBH & ABH. 2 robbery. 4 domestic abuse. 12 criminal damage to vehicle or building. 1 Burglary and 1 rape. The remainder being made up of other investigation types.

12 Investigations: 1 burglary dwelling - insecure premises entered and cash removed. 3 theft related - 1 theft of motor vehicle, 1 from motor vehicle and 1 make off without payment. 1 Threats to kill. 2 common assault - no injury. 2 domestic abuse. 1 criminal damage to motor vehicle - road rage related on A14. 1 harassment. 1 malicious communications.

FURTHER INFORMATION

There has been a rise in the number of theft from motor vehicles during October particularly targeting Catalytic Converters. Our offenders prefer to work in the quiet hours and are specifically targeting Honda's. There is quite a big market for catalytic converters and whilst we work to build up the intelligence picture around this specific crime series we are urging the public to be alert to this crime and take preventative measures to secure your vehicle, especially if it is a Honda. Please see the below advice:

Police are warning all vehicle owners that there has been a series of recent thefts of catalytic converters in areas of West Suffolk - including Eriswell, Lakenheath, Bury St Edmunds, Red Lodge, and Haverhill. Commercial vehicles and 4 wheel drives are particularly at risk because the higher ground clearance allows easier access for the criminals who target them.

To reduce the likelihood of becoming a victim:

- Garage your car whenever possible
- Park in well-lit, busy areas
- Look out for people working under cars
- If the vehicle is high risk, consider marking the metal shell of the converter with a unique mark, so that if it is removed by thieves it will be easier to trace back to your vehicle. Various marking methods are commercially available.
- If you operate a small fleet, consider obstructing access to vehicles with high ground clearance, by parking lower vehicles close by

If you have any information that may assist police, call 101. In an emergency or where immediate response is required always call 999.

You SNT officers do hold catalytic converter marking sessions and these are published on our website, the next session will be a closed session held on RAF Lakenheath due to the high volume of Honda's owned by USAF personnel.

Proactive Work:

1. Speed checks carried out on Snailwell Road during October resulted in 8 drivers being reported for excessive speed and 2 verbally warned.
2. Officers tasked with parking enforcement issued 31 Fixed Penalty Notices for parking violations in and around the Town Centre during October.
