UPDATE ON CRIME DATA:

Crime data is for July 2016. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

CURRENT ISSUES:

Parking issues continue with the High Street and surrounding areas - Officers from the SNT have agreed with the Town Council to carry out a half day of action per week to deal with the rise in parking related complaints within these areas and any others that become a persistent problem. Each problem will be looked at and dealt with in priority of Threat, Harm and Risk.

Increased reports of speeding along Snailwell Road - Officers have been conducting speed checks in this area as well as supporting the existing Community Speed Watch Schemes in existence. If you are interested in joining the Newmarket CSW then please contact us via the email address below.

CRIME REDUCTION ADVICE:

Bogus Callers - Following recent reports of bogus callers in the West of the county, we are encouraging friends, family and neighbours to spread the word to ensure everyone is aware of distraction burglaries or bogus callers so that they do not become a victim. If they witness any suspicious or unusual behaviour then immediately call police on 999.


People can take the following steps to guard against bogus callers;

- Think before you open the door, and keep all you doors and windows secure whilst you answer the front door.
- Consider displaying a 'No Cold Calling sticker' on your door. Please contact your safer neighbourhood team for more information.
- Always ask for ID, take it from the caller through the letterbox and read it carefully and do not admit anyone who you feel

- Keep an eye on neighbours, friends and family, call 999 if you think a bogus caller is at your property.

Church Lead Theft - Rural churches are often targeted due to their isolated locations, so members of the public are asked to report any suspicious activity they see. Stealing a large amount of lead takes time and a reasonably large vehicle to transport it, so any early reports will assist police in locating offenders.

Chief Inspector Matt Rose said "We are asking local people to take an interest in their local church whilst they are out and about. If you take the dog out for a walk, or go for a stroll, don't ignore anything that you think looks out of place - report anything you think may be suspicious to the police. Communities can act as our eyes and ears, and by pulling together to note suspicious activity, we can deter thieves and help keep these historic buildings safe."

You may have heard that Police Direct has now been replaced with Police Connect. This is a free messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news and information for any local area of Suffolk that you wish to specify. You can choose to receive messages via text, email or phone.
