# FUTURE EVENTS

SNT officers will be attending engagements (subject to operational commitments) with: Crucial Crew at West Row Stadium will be running all week from 6th March 2017 to 9th March 2017, supported by Officers from Mildenhall SNT. There will also be a Crime Prevention stall at the Guineas Shopping Centre in Newmarket on Tuesday 21st March 2017 between 10am and 12pm. Mildenhall cadets meet every Sunday morning at St Mary's school Mildenhall and on the 11th March 2017 there is an information morning at St Marys for anyone interested in joining. Officers will also be undertaking town centre patrols, licensing checks and speed enforcement throughout the month.



# FURTHER INFORMATION

Between 1st - 28th February 2017 there have been 327 incidents and 141 investigations within the 4 wards that make up Newmarket and Exning Parishes. Many of these investigations recorded relate to thefts from the retail outlets within the town, public order, criminal damage, minor assaults with no injury and vulnerable adult and child referrals to our specialised departments.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD 1st February - 28th February 2017

St Mary's

45 investigations: 2 x attempted burglary dwellings, 1 x burglary other building, 1 x attempted burglary other building, 3 x violence with injury, 2 x thefts from vehicle, 2 x theft from shop, 5 x theft other with the remaining being made up of other investigation types.

All Saints

39 investigations: 2 x burglary other building, 1 x sexual assault, 1 x robbery, 4 x violence with injury, 1 x stalking involving fear of violence, 3 x theft from shops, 5 x theft other with the remaining being made up of other investigation types.

Severals

57 investigations: 1 x burglary dwelling, 2 x burglary other building, 2 x attempted burglary other building, 5 x violence with injury, 1 x attempted robbery, 4 x theft from vehicle, 7 x theft from shop, 2 x theft from person, 4 x theft other, 3 x criminal damage to vehicle, 2 x criminal damage to building with the remaining being made up of other investigation types.

Exning

8 investigations: 3 x burglary other building, 1 x attempted burglary other building, 1 x theft of horse trailer, 1 x theft from shop, 1 x criminal damage to a vehicle, 1 x public order incident.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

With Spring on its way and thoughts turning to outside projects we would just like to remind everyone about Garden Shed and Garage security.

Criminals are not only interested in the property in your house.

They can also be tempted by goods and equipment stored outside in garages, sheds and even the garden.

Property such as bicycles, lawnmowers and power tools can be just as valuable as televisions, stereos and DVD players.

However a few simple steps can help keep equipment safe while deterring thieves and burglars.

Garages, sheds and other outbuildings.

Ensure that the building is in good condition and look to improve security by:-

1. Fixing mesh or bars on the inside of windows
2. Fitting good locks to all doors. Padlocks should be at least 6cm/2.5 ins wide, hardened steel, have at least 5 pins and be close shackled type.
3. Fittings should be bolted through the door and reinforced at the back with a steel plate or washer; hasps should have concealed screws.
4. Fitting additional locks to up-and-over garage doors.
5. Considering an alarm - either a battery-operated alarm or upgraded house alarm which includes the garage or shed.

It is important to use locks at all time, even if you are at home.

Always keep keys safe and out of sight.

Property

1. Secure all items that could be easily removed - they could be used to break into your house.
2. Security mark property such as lawn mowers, furniture and tools with your postcode and advertise the fact that they are marked. Keep a note of serial/make/model numbers.
3. Take photographs of any valuable garden ornaments.
4. Ensure bicycles are security marked.

Outside

1. Consider installing security lights to both illuminate your garden and deter thieves.
2. Keep shrubs, bushes, hedges cut back as they can provide a hiding place for thieves.
3. Check that all boundary fences, walls and gates are in good repair.

And finally if you are at all suspicious of anyone call the police immediately.
