Responding to issues in your community

This month, our priorities are Thurston Youth nuisance and Night time economy relating to Christmas.

Work is due to be carried out by Crest Nicholson, 7th January 19 in a bid to design out crime and ASB in the area of Cedars Park, Stowmarket.

The Egret Drive area of Stowmarket has seen, in the last few months, a heavy rise in the amount of Calls regarding crime and ASB (anti social behaviour). Due to this we have carried out partnership working, made arrests, issued Community protection notices, and the culmination is that the person at the centre of this no longer resides at the property, and will appear in Court in the New Year.

Following work with private car park owners, this month, we have issued 4 x section 59 warnings for people using their vehicles in an Anti social manner, next time we can seize the cars.

Making the community safer

Throughout the month, we have attended numerous events, including Hinderclay Parish council meeting, Framsdon Parish council meeting, Thurston Christmas market, Somersham Community shop, Older persons fair at Needham Market and we are regulars at Needham Market car boot.

Several of these events have been attended by our new, Mid Suffolk District Council funded, PSCO, Bill Butcher. Much of Bill's role will take him out in the community across Mid Suffolk, and he will be a very welcome addition to the team.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

1st December saw the launch of our campaign against those people driving under the influence of drink or drugs. In last years campaign we tested 1,751 people were tested and 70 failed for drink driving and 43 for drug driving.

We will be continuing to target those people in the community who cause ASB by the use and supply of drugs. This will include robust action against 'County lines' style of supply, and we will update regularly on our Facebook page (@StowmarketPolice) and Twitter (@PoliceStow), with results.
