Responding to issues in your community

This month our Priorities and HVP's (High visibility patrols) are The Recreation ground, Stowmarket, Mendlesham and Cedars Park.

Following reports of ASB at The Recreation ground, we will be carrying out patrols and taking robust action against offenders.

We will be patrolling Mendlesham regularly, reports of ASB will be responded to as quickly as possible and offenders dealt with.

We continue to patrol Cedars Park, and deal with reported ASB. Crest Nicholson have said their work to assist in the prevention of ASB/crime will be carried out Mid November, the other agencies are expected to carry out theirs once this is completed.

Following reports of vehicle ASB in Stowmarket and surrounding areas, we carried out and evening of action, this saw one vehicle being seized, two offences of 'No insurance', one offence of 'No MOT', and several other traffic offences being dealt with.

Making the community safer

In October, since the last Newsletter, Stowmarket SNT have carried out a number of engagements including Fanningham parish meeting, a meeting with Bacton Royal British Legion, 'Jam community Pot', Offton and Willisham Parish meeting, to name a few.

On the 29th October we introduced our new Safer Neighbourhood Teams across Suffolk. There are now 7 additional Pc's covering the area of Mid Suffolk, and their primary focus is to investigate volume crime. Unfortunately as part of this re-structure, we have also lost a number of PCSO's from our local area. We will continue to work closely with our partner agencies under this new model to help reduce demand and reduce crime in our community.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

On 27th October we launched a week of '1st Principle'. This is a library of crime prevention, security and safety advice and can be accessed from www.suffolk.police.uk/1stprinciple

During this week, we chose a different crime prevention topic each day to promote by meetings, group inputs and public engagements.

On Saturday 27th October 18, Stowmarket SNT carried out another Police surgery in Stowmarket Town Centre. This was another success and gave us the opportunity to talk about 1st Principle, and target 'Home security' in particular
