WE DID...

1. A derelict premises in the area has now been boarded up following SNT intervention reducing the demand caused by young people gaining access to the site.
2. Engaged with partners and residents to build a picture of what the issues are. Have used Police and Council powers to focus attention on key offenders.
3. Multi-agency meeting has taken place and a range of tactics have been discussed and deployed, including increased patrols by Police and Streetwatch, and education given in senior schools. The Council are considering Public Space Protection orders, and how this may benefit the longer term aims of the park. Work here is on-going.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

## - UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is for June 2016. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

Following last month's publication of crime figures, and subsequent feedback it appears not all Parish Councils are aware of the National Police Crime Data website run by the Home Office. ([www.police.uk](http://www.police.uk)). It's been in existence for some years and is owned and publicised by the Home Office. It contains all your local crime data, stop search data and other similar information. During the implementation of the Suffolk Local Policing Review this information was shared at SALC meetings but we thought we would take this opportunity to remind you of its existence.

## - EXPLANATION OF CRIME DATA

Violence with Injury includes the offences of Actual bodily harm (ABH) and above (Based on level of injury)

Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) will include rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour, street drinking, littering etc.

Incidents recorded - Includes all incident 'logs' created by our control room for the areas included within this news letter.

Investigations recorded includes all crimes, child / adult referral forms to other agencies (inc mental health), and Domestic abuse. We have to record much more than just crime!

During the coming months, you will be able to compare data on a month to month basis.

We continue to carry out joint patrols with the Town Wardens in order to enhance our public engagement, build community intelligence and target areas of concern, like anti-social use of motorcycles in Shawlands Wood, and street drinking & begging in Sudbury Town Centre.

# FURTHER INFORMATION

## - PRIORITY UPDATES

Eves Orchard, bures - We have received numerous complaints relating to anti-social behaviour in this area. We have worked with the local Council and residents to identify the key issues and are now using Police powers along with the Council to counter some of the problems, but more importantly reduce the long term harm in the area.

Missing Children - Regular meetings continue to take place with care homes and safer Neighbourhood team (SNT) officers. Progress has been made with reviews taking place around suitability of particular children at particular homes. All partner agencies have the safety and welfare of each child as their priority. Work will continue.

Derelict premises, Gt Cornard - We have addressed local concerns of young people regularly getting into the site, and have liaised with the land owner and estate agent to ensure it is better secured. As of 30th July, the premises has now been boarded up. Local schools have also received inputs from us pointing out the offences, and severe health and safety issues.

## CRIME REDUCTION ADVICE

Property Marking - There are a number of ways of security marking your valuables to protect them against theft and assist police to return them to you if they have been recovered. These include Ultra violet (UV) or invisible marking, Engraving or etching, Ceramic marking or Forensics marking solutions as offered by firms such as Smartwater ([www.smartwater.com](http://www.smartwater.com)) and Selectadna ([www.selectadna.co.uk](http://www.selectadna.co.uk)).

Photograph your valuables - Photographs should be taken against a plain background and include a ruler to give an idea of size.

Close it, Lock it, Check it - Open windows can be seen as opportunities for burglars. Please ensure that downstairs windows and other ones vulnerable to entry are shut. When leaving home check that all windows have been shut and locked.

Review your home security regularly - We suggest you look at the Secured by design - [www.securedbydesign.com](http://www.securedbydesign.com) - for Police approved supplies of everything from Door locks to fencing to intruder alarms.

Cyber Crime - Get Safe Online at [www.getsafeonline.org/norfolksuffolk](http://www.getsafeonline.org/norfolksuffolk) has advice on personal and business internet use including safeguarding children, physical protection of smartphones and tablets. It also has info on the different types of internet fraud, how to protect your internet connection and much more.
