YOU SAID...

1. Reduce anti-social behaviour in Great Cornard
2. Target the anti-social use of motorvehicles in Long Melford
3. Reduce crime and ASB in Belle Vue Park, Sudbury

WE DID...

1. Worked with partners to identify the cause of the anti-social behaviour and spoke to residents in the area to build evidence. Worked with social services in diverting three young people away from the area, as well as enforcing tenancy agreements with Solo Housing resulting in the eviction of two local residents.
2. Worked with local Councillors in identifying the relevant days and times. Carried out hi-visibility patrols and speed checks to focus on casualty reduction, and reported one motorist for driving and public order offences.
3. Multi-agency meeting has taken place and a range of tactics have been discussed and deployed, including increased patrols by Police and Streetwatch, and education given in senior schools. The Council are considering Public Space Protection orders, and how this may benefit the longer term aims of the park. Work here is on-going.

- UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is now available. Thank you for your understanding whilst we implemented and tested our new computer system. We know that this has caused some uncertainty and frustration. You will notice that the data is for May 2016. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

- EXPLANATION OF CRIME DATA

There were 15 house burglary crimes in May 16. The Location for eleven of these crimes was covered in the last newsletter as they were believed to form part of a series. We are please to report that this series stopped. Although no arrests were made, the investigation is still live and being conducted by the CID department.

Violence with Injury includes the offences of Actual bodily harm (ABH) and above (Based on level of injury)

Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) will include rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour, street drinking, littering etc.

Incidents recorded - Includes all incident 'logs' created by our control room for the areas included within this news letter.

Investigations recorded includes all crimes, child / adult referral forms to other agencies (inc mental health), and Domestic abuse. We have to record much more than just crime!

During the coming months, you will be able to compare data on a month to month basis.

We continue to carry out joint patrols with the Town Wardens in order to enhance our public engagement, build community intelligence and target areas of concern, like anti-social use of motorcycles in Shawlands Wood, and street drinking & begging in Sudbury Town Centre.

- PRIORITY UPDATES

Siam Place - We have maximised engagement opportunities with the persons who frequent the gardens, and are providing support and education to them in order to reduce the anti-social behaviour. We are also building evidence against one male in order to issue him with a Community Protection Notice. We have already seen a large reduction in calls to the area.

Missing Children - Regular meetings continue to take place with care homes and safer Neighbourhood team (SNT) officers. Progress has been made with reviews taking place around suitability of particular children at particular homes. All partner agencies have the safety and welfare of each child as their priority. Work will continue.

Derelict premises, Gt Cornard - We have addressed local concerns of young people regularly getting into the site, and have liaised with the land owner and estate agent to ensure it is better secured. Local schools have also received inputs from us pointing out the offences, and severe health and safety issues.

- OTHER NEWS

Update on Vehicle Damage, Ballingdon Street (Sudbury). Overnight 13th - 14th May 16. We are pleased to report that two people answered bail and were charged with these offences. We now await the court result.

- Now that the new model of delivering your local policing is 3 months old we wanted to remind you of the many ways you can get in touch with us.

Most importantly, if it's an emergency always ring 999. However, if it's not an emergency but you wish to report a crime or a concern for safety then use 101. If you simply wish to contact your local team, perhaps to tell us about Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) or to tell us about your concerns about how the police have handled a local community matter, why not in the first instance speak with your local SNT Sergeant and discuss the matter with them?

Your local Sergeant will be able to review the matter and, if required report back to you with their findings.

If you want to speak to a local SNT officer and it's not urgent then an email will be quickest means to get in contact, and if you need a reply then a member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs.

Remember, the demand on 101 is very high and if you don't need to report a crime we would encourage the use of email.

Finally, our brand new and interactive website will be on-line in the Autumn which will give you direct access to your teams in a fast, secure format, as well as providing loads of really useful information.
