YOU SAID...

1. Deal with street drinking related ASB in Siam Place
2. Reduce the demand created by frequent missing children at local homes
3. Tackle damage caused to a derelict premise in Gt. Cornard

WE DID...

1. Sudbury does not have a 'Public Spaces Protection Order to prevent drinking of alcohol in public. We are therefore gathering evidence of associated ASB which may enable other enforcement powers to be used. On-Going
2. The SNT Young Persons link officer is holding regular meetings with children's homes, working with staff to set local service agreements for when a person should be reported missing and what action is taken on receipt of a missing report.
3. The SNT have contacted the land owners making them aware of the situation, and are liaising with Babergh District Council to improve the security of the site. Targeted patrols have helped build intelligence around who is entering the building in order to progress with enforcement.

- UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

We were expecting crime data to be published this month for May 16 but this has unfortunately not been possible. The reasons for this revolve around our ICT system which has not been performing as we would have wanted recently and we cannot currently guarantee the accuracy of the data we might publish. We have therefore made the decision not to publish at this time rather than publish misleading data and misrepresent the true situation, either positively or negatively. We know this is frustrating for communities. Our ICT team are working very hard to rectify this situation and have given assurances that it will soon be resolved. Sorting this out is a priority for us and we offer our apologies at this time. We hope normal service will soon be restored.

- PRIORITY UPDATES

-The recent priority in tackling shed and garage burglaries has now been concluded. The series has clearly ended following operation 'Planetary' which was commissioned to address a high number of reported crimes. Details of arrests were covered in previous newsletters and suspects remain on Police bail whilst the investigations continue.

Shed and garage burglary traditionally increases at this time of year and so we ask that all residents remain vigilant and report suspicious behaviour to us using 999 / 101. If crime reduction advice is needed please make contact with your SNT using the details below.

-Long Melford Sports ground - Officers conducted patrols at key times. Reports of ASB have now stopped and so this problem will be monitored.

- CRIME SERIES

We are currently having a series of house burglaries / Attempted burglaries. The areas of Boxted x 1 / Gt Cornard x 2 / Boxford x 1 / Newton x 1 / Lawshall x 1 / Leavenheath x 1 / Alpheton x 2 / Brundon x 1 Sudbury East x 1 are affected with a total of 11 since 1st May 16. The main method used to gain access is to force (Jemmy) a window or to smash a window / patio doors. CID are investigating these crimes and patrols have been briefed to target the areas identified.

As above, report suspicious behaviour to us using 999 / 101. If crime reduction advice is needed please make contact with your SNT using the details below.

- Vehicle Damage, Ballingdon Street (Sudbury). Overnight 13th - 14th May 16, around 20 vehicles were damaged when two suspects decided to kick off the wing mirrors of parked cars. Two people were arrested and are currently on Police bail. Charges for these offences are expected when the two return.

- OTHER NEWS

-PcsO Grant Skeggs has been developing his link role with young people. During May he carried out Social Media Talk to Years 5 & 6 at Woodhall Primary School, Sudbury, Covered Stranger Danger at Tudor Primary School, Sudbury and Acton Primary School and gave Road Safety Awareness Talks in Bildeston primary School.

- CCTV Volunteers 'wanted' for Sudbury - As you may know, Sudbury town centre's CCTV system is monitored by volunteers who play an important part in keeping the community safe.
